Memorial tribute for Trooper Guthrie to be erected

The tragic accident on August 1, 2011, that claimed the lives of Missouri Highway Patrol Trooper Frederick F. Guthrie, Jr., of Platte City, MO, and his Patrol K-9 Reed, will be commemorated and honored via a memorial to be erected near the original site in late summer 2013. Trooper Guthrie and his K-9 partner had been assigned Missouri River flood duty, and were working in the area of Big Lake, MO, on Missouri Highway 118 at Missouri Highway 111, when the duo was apparently swept away by swift floodwaters.

The memorial will be erected on land donated by Donald Tubbs, a Big Lake, MO, farmer who farms the land near the accident site. The southeast corner of Highway 111 and the Highway 118 interchange will be used for the nearly 20' diameter raised platform memorial. It will be built through donations and volunteer efforts in time for the August 1, 2013, dedication date.

The spherical memorial will be raised with a ramp for entrance and a sidewalk. Momuments commemorating the contributions of Trooper Guthrie,

K-9 Reed, and others who have died serving to protect Holt County will be erected on the platform. Meditation benches, and American and Missouri flags will also be flown at the site.

"This is a nice way of honoring those who gave their lives trying to protect our community," stated Larry Knapp, one of the organizers of the project.

The group of volunteers that are spearheading this endeavor will be holding fundraisers to assist in defraying the costs. The first fundraiser, a gun raffle for a Henry Golden Boy Law Enforcement Tribute Edition, is already underway. Tickets for the gun raffle can be purchased at White Rose Restaurant in Mound City, or by contacting Larry Knapp.

Many locals, including Jeff Karsten with J&E Construction, Knapp Construction, Larry Russell, J&J Landscaping and Irrigation, as well as the Missouri Highway Patrol, and Platte City and Weston business leaders are helping with the project.

911 service needs emergency attention

According to the Holt County Commission minutes dated December 10, 2012, Holt County Clerk Kathy Kunkel formally resigned from having any involvement in the development or maintenance of the county's 911 system, stating 'she has no statutory obligation to be involved'.

While talking to the *Mound City News*, Kunkel stated that she basically inherited the position when she became clerk. With the county's perpetual conversion to a new 911 system that has cost taxpayers \$100,000 thus far, things are just not being done, and Kunkel stated that there continues to be 'unresolved issues'. The clerk's letter to the commission noted that she, nor her office, will be involved in the 911 addressing or mapping system that Kunkel stated 'is not currently being used by Sheriff Scott Wedlock'.

Funding from the 1/4¢ tax, which took effect in the 1990's, has been used to fund the upgrades to the 911 system. Upkeep and repairs to the old system were financially detrimental. Computers for the new mapping system, a large format printer and components, and plat book components are some of the new elements of the system. The new system, Phase I, is in place with components that include Component Aided Dispatch (CAD), which is software that works when calls come in; Integrity Web System, which is the digital mapping system; and some upgrades through CenturyLink, which required all new wiring.

Despite the fact that there is all new wiring, streamlined use of the components is far from reality. Both the sheriff and communications supervisor, Lydia Campbell, are frustrated with the speed of internet service through Farmer's Mutual Telephone Company in Oregon, MO, which often hinders timely information flow.

At the same December 10 commission meeting, Sheriff Wedlock reminded the commission that he is not the 911 coordinator, and that Holt County is unique in having the 911 dispatched from the jail. "Holt County jailors are responsible for a myriad of duties," stated Wedlock, "for which they are normally underpaid, overworked and understaffed."

The commission has discussed ways to alleviate the 911 obstacles. Taking the services out of the jail would be very costly; charging for dispatching services has met with great resistance; and availability of funds to offer better pay for dispatchers is far from perfected. Currently, there are 5 full-time and part-time dispatchers. (There have been 52 employees come and go since Sheriff Wedlock took office in 2009).

Local fire department chiefs discussed the dispatching services at the December 10 commission meeting also. They were concerned over the delay in paging that has come out of the dispatch, and the fact that on more than one occasion, a deputy has been sent out on a fire call before the departments have been dispatched.

"We'd like to see dispatchers have proper training and

procedures followed, so that these kinds of situations are curbed," remarked Southern Fire Protection District Fire Chief Troy Cotton in regard to the mishandled fire calls.

The 911 system has not moved forward to Phase II type service, however, the commission recently approved, in its 2013 budget, new recording equipment, and the CenturyLink contract to move forward with Phase II service, as well as increasing the base salary for dispatchers in hopes to lure and keep personnel.

"Making the new system work in an 1869 building has challenges of its own," stated Presiding Commissioner, Mark Sitherwood. "Implementing system upon system creates lots of problems. We want everyone to have topnotch emergency service, but that can't be done quickly. However, all the components are in place for it."

So where does that leave Holt County? It appears that it leaves Holt County with a \$100,000 911 system that just needs someone to run it, because it---isn't the clerk's job---it isn't the sheriff's job---it isn't the commissioners' job---and it's being run by dispatchers who lack adequate training. Should citizens be concerned?

County officials sworn in

Holt County elected officials for the 2013-2017 term were sworn in at a brief ceremony on Monday, December 31, at the Holt County Courthouse in Oregon, MO. The officials were sworn in by County Clerk Kathy Kunkel. They assumed county responsibilities on Wednesday, January 2, 2013.

Two new faces and four returning faces assume four-year terms at the Holt County Courthouse. Officials sworn in include: David Carroll, 2nd District County Commissioner; Assessor LaDonna Jones; Sheriff Scott Wedlock; 1st District Commissioner Bill Gordon (3rd term); Coroner Susan Lentz; and Public Administrator Ed Meng.

Water main break in Forest City

On Saturday, December 29, residents of Forest City, MO, reported a loss in water pressure. Oregon Water Superintendent Bill Prussman, who handles the water supply to Forest City, began searching for an explanation in the three miles of main from Oregon to Forest City.

On Wednesday, January 2, the break was discovered 13'-14' deep in the bottom of Forest Brook. The break occurred in the 6" main line that is buried 6 feet deep under the bed of the creek. The line is nearly 100 years old.

Kissick Construction was called in and arrived on Thursday, January 3, to begin



the process of digging up the line and repairing it. The company used four 2" pumps to keep the water out as workers dug through boulders to get to the line. Eventually, water to Forest City had to be shut off in order to

make the repair.

Shutting the water off forced a boil advisory to be issued for residents of the community beginning on Friday, January 4, following the repairs, which were done by noon. Water customers were advised to boil water for cooking and drinking during that time. The boil order remained in effect until Wednesday, January 9.

Squaw Creek Refuge completes 24th annual deer hunt

Squaw Creek National Wildlife Refuge near Mound City, MO, completed the annual white-tailed deer muzzle loader hunts for last weekend. The hunts were held on January 5th and 6th, 2013. The 2-day hunts are a part of the Missouri Department of Conservation's (MDC) managed deer hunt program. Hunters are required to apply for the drawing done each August. Refuge staff, Missouri Department of Conservation employees, and volunteers from Missouri Western State University organize and manage the hunt. A total of 317 hunters applied for the 85 permits that were issued for the antler-less portion and 1,034 hunters applied for the 15 any deer permits. Each hunter selected was able to harvest up to two deer using muzzle loading firearms. A total of 83 hunters participated in the hunt harvesting 26 deer including 19 doe and 7 button bucks.

Refuge staff and volunteers are working to collect as much scientific information on the deer population as possible to better understand herd health. In an effort to better manage deer harvested annually on the refuge, animals are weighed and aged, as well as collecting fetus information, blood samples, lymph nodes, front incisors and brains. The front incisor teeth help biologists get more information on deer age and growth rates. The fe-

tus length will be used to precisely identify the peak of the rut each fall.

The Squaw Creek Refuge deer hunt program was initiated in January, 1988, to reduce an expanding deer herd that was causing considerable damage to refuge habitats and private croplands adjoining the refuge. The deer hunt harvest helps also decrease deer vehicle collisions that can result in

personal injuries along Highways 118, 159, and Interstate 29. The hunt is a continuing effort by Squaw Creek Refuge and the Missouri Department of Conservation to provide quality public hunting opportunities and sound wildlife management. Buchanan and Andrew counties' extension agreements scheduled

The Buchanan County Ag Update will be held Wednesday, January 16, at the Buchanan County Extension office in St. Joseph, MO. The Andrew County Ag Update will be held Thursday, January 17, at the Clasbey Building in Savannah, MO. The meetings will begin at 8 a.m. for growers to attend private applicator pesticide training and at 10 a.m., presentations will be given that will address drought topics for cattle producers. Please RSVP to Buchanan Extension office at 816-279-1691 and Andrew County at 816-324-3147. The meetings will end at noon.

The first two hours of the meeting will be a pest management update included in the private applicator pesti-

cide training. This portion of the meeting will handle the requirements for growers who need to recertify their private applicator pesticide licenses or for those who need a license. The pest update will also provide important information for growers for the 2013 growing season. Growers who do not need a license will also benefit from attending this session handled by Wayne Flanary, Extension Agronomist.

Following the pest management update will be presentations from regional staff about issues important to area farmers. Jim Crawford, Ag Engineer, will present the yield benefit of no-till compared to other types of tillage last spring.

Bob Kelly, Ag Business Specialist, will answer questions about crop rental agreements, cash rent and how to handle drought from a business perspective.

Jim Humphrey, Livestock Specialist, will present strategies and ideas to manage the beef herd through the drought.

Tom Fowler, Horticulture Specialist, will update on the 2013 weather and how to help plants around the farmstead survive the drought.

Happy New Year!! However, it doesn't look like a very happy new year is in store for anyone. I guess if you have fairly good health though, that's something to be happy about. We sure can't say that about the health of our nation and the rest of the world for that matter. Hopefully, it gets better quickly.

When I was a kid growing up, I don't remember ever paying any attention to the coming of a new year. Maybe in the cities they did, but out on the farm, no. While I was in the military, just Thanksgiving and Christmas were recognized. Being war time may have had something to do with that too.

Gradually, we grew into looking forward to the new year, especially when we moved south where a New Year's dinner of 'black eyed peas and corn bread' was a tradition. That's what we found out when we moved to Louisiana in 1959. It was also believed by some that black eyed peas gave you good luck all the coming new year. We never believed it ourselves, but it made a great meal or a snack to have while watching a parade or a football game on TV. Every year since 1959, we have had that traditional dinner.

Some other traditions are also good to have. Up until a couple years ago, Betty always made our black eyed peas in a crock pot, but then we started buying them in a can so I could do it. This year, with the help from a neighbor's eggs, I made (or rather Jiffy mix and I) the best moist corn bread ever. I'm just about old enough to sit down with a glass of milk and stuff it with corn bread for a treat. Remember when that was a popular thing for older folks to do? That was something my grandmother liked and Betty always fixed her dad up with some whenever they were here on vacation. She made it from scratch, the way he liked it.

Over the years, it depended on where we were living as to how we celebrated New Year's Eve. State Treasurer Clint Zweifel returns \$19.5 million in unclaimed property in first 6 months of fiscal year 2013

Returns property to more than 71,000 account holders, on pace for record breaking year

State Treasurer Clint Zweifel (ZWY-ful) announced he has returned \$19.5 million in Unclaimed Property in the first six months of fiscal year 2013. The total number of accounts returned in the first six months is on record pace with 71,000 returned. That is an 11 percent increase over the same time the previous year.

"It is important to me to return unclaimed property in the most efficient, transparent and customer friendly way I can," Treasurer Zweifel said. "Individuals can sign up for email notifications, email search results to family and friends and search for property online 24 hours-a-day at www.ShowMeMoney.com. You can begin the claims process online and I never charge to return unclaimed property."

Since January, 2009, Treasurer Zweifel has returned \$140 million to more than 450,000 account holders and cut wait times for unclaimed property in half. More than 73,000 paperless claims have been paid, and more than 61,000 people have signed up for

email notifications.

The current 12-month unclaimed property records were set by Treasurer Zweifel in fiscal year 2012 when he returned \$38.2 million to a record 130,000 account holders, breaking his previous record of \$36 million to 120,000 account holders set in fiscal year 2011.

Treasurer Zweifel holds nearly \$700 million for more than 4.3 million account holders. There are 61 accounts with more than \$100,000 each waiting to be claimed. For more information about unclaimed property, go to www.ShowMeMoney.com.

Minor injuries received in two-vehicle accident on I-29

Heather R. Sipes, age 19, of Oregon, MO, and Barbara L. Rush, age 40, Zacchaeus A. Jackson, age 12, Mary L. Overstreet, age 17, and Mario T.

Rush, age 21, all of Horn Lake, MS, were involved in a two-vehicle accident at 10:55 a.m. on Interstate 29, five miles east of Oregon on Monday, December 31, 2012. The accident occurred as both vehicles were southbound on I-29. Sipes, driving a 2004 GMC Safari Van, had previously stopped on the right shoulder and then re-entered the traffic flow in front of Rush, who was driving a 2003 Ford Windstar Van. MU climatologist: 2012 will be state's warmest year on record

2012 will be the warmest year on record in Missouri since 1895, when established instrumental temperature records began, according to Pat Guinan, extension climatologist with the University of Missouri (MU) Commercial Agriculture Program.

Guinan presented his findings at the MU Crop Management Conference, Dec. 18 in Columbia, MO, and at the recent Missouri Livestock Symposium in Kirksville, MO.

December temperatures were running well above normal, punctuating a year dominated by unusually high temperatures and drought. "The year could also rank among the top 10 driest years on record, and driest since 1980, but we won't know for certain until all the data for the state are processed," Guinan said.

Since the spring of 2010, only a handful of months have had below-normal temperatures in Missouri, Guinan said. March, 2012, had temperatures that were an incredible 14 degrees above normal, giving farmers a record head start on planting corn crops.

"Warm spring trends over the past few decades have extended the growing season," Guinan said. "Our median spring freeze date is occurring three to four days earlier compared to the long term." The median date of first fall frosts has not changed much, he said.

Many sunny days in May and June, coupled with above-normal temperatures and below-normal relative humidity, led to unusually high moisture loss from soils, water surfaces and vegetation. The high evaporative losses, in combination with lack of rainfall, resulted in a "flash drought" across the state. Reports of deteriorating pastures, declining soil moisture reserves, limited stock water supplies and crop stress increased significantly as summer progressed.

Drought impacts continued to mount in July, including widespread crop and pasture losses, livestock stress, and declining stock water and hay supplies. Hydrological issues

such as dry wells and stream beds, low river levels, and rural and urban water restrictions were increasingly common.

Even with burn bans in place, grass fires and forest fires continued to be reported. The extreme conditions affected gardens, lawns, trees and shrubs, with numerous instances of vulnerable species succumbing to water and heat stress. Wildlife was affected by the lack of healthy vegetation and dwindling water resources. By the end of July, Missouri had the distinction of having the worst corn, soybean and pasture conditions in the United States, according to the National Agricultural Statistics Service. It was also the third-warmest and driest May through July on record for Missouri.

The remnants of Hurricane Isaac brought the first widespread relief to the state at the end of August. Some stressed vegetation began to green up again, but for many crops and other plant species the damage had already been done.

Even though overall drought conditions improved across portions of Missouri this fall, a complete recharge of water resources above and below the ground had not been realized by the end of December. Winter is typically the dry season in Missouri and it is unlikely that surface and ground water supplies will fully recover for the start of next year's growing season in many parts of the state.

The highest likelihood for hydrological drought carrying over into 2013 is across northwestern Missouri, which typically receives only 3-4 inches of precipitation between December and February—not nearly enough to make up for a year-end precipitation deficit of more than a foot.

Southern and eastern sections of the state have better chances for drought recovery. Heavier autumn precipitation has occurred there and more winter precipitation generally falls.







Built in the late 1880s, it is still standing in disrepair, but the beautiful structure was once a favorite place to meet friends. Many news items in the history book, "Craig, Town....County....Country 1892-1898" by Carolyn Kent, refer to a variety of events held in the grand old building. Dinners, programs, even an Easter bazaar, along with impressive speakers and plays, were featured there. Many remember attending movies in the theatre in later years. What memories the old building holds!! The photo at left is from Lillian Wright.

- A grand opening for Craig Supply Co. was advertised. Nixon Feeds was to be stocked. Special prices were listed for hog, poultry, and cattle feeds.
- Pettijohn & Crawford advertised a 17" round, colonial print, washable vinyl upholstery, early American hassock for \$7.95.

25 Years Ago - 1987

- The Mound City Steak House fell victim to thieves. Several steaks and whiskey were among the items taken. Phil Blazer, an employee of R.R. Stuart, recovered 28 filet steaks, which were found in the cab of an abandoned trash truck at the old highway barn.
- Cuts in the proposed budget for Holt County had to made. Sheriff Bernie Delaney was advised that his office would need to trim his budget approximately 25 percent.
- The Mound City Boy Scouts started the new year with a regular meeting schedule. George Bohn has taken over the reins as scoutmaster.
- Mollus Taxidermists have their hands full for the next few months. One hundred and ninety deer head and antlers await mounting, as do approximately 100 birds. About 50 birds have already been mounted.

- Preliminary budget work projected drops in property and sales taxes in 2003 for Holt County.
- Mound City's zoning board did not grant a zoning variance to allow U.S. Asphalt to put up an asphalt plant on the Heck Implement property for planned paving of I-29 the upcoming summer.
- Candidates for Craig's basketball courtwarming celebration were: Lindsey Schmidt, Shelby Gillenwater, Mallory Ferguson, Darcy Kent, Ben Leseberg, Jordan Kent, Aaron Haer, and Travis Kent.
- Mound City beat Craig and South Nodaway in basketball contests. The Mound City boys were 7-3 and the girls were 8-2.
- The Nodaway-Holt boys beat Fairfax 26-23 and the girls lost 46-20.

Holt County Commission minutes

The Holt County Commission met Monday, December 10, 2012, at 9:00 a.m. with Presiding Commissioner Mark Sitherwood, First District Commissioner Bill Gordon and Second District Commissioner Don Holstine present. Second District Commissioner-Elect David Carroll was also in attendance.

Commissioners took up bids for 2013 CART, project and other road rock. Roe Simmon, Norris Quarries, and Nick Jamison, Schildberg, were in attendance. The bids were opened as follows: Bid #1 Norris Quarry, 1 inch and 1 ¼ inch road stone, \$10.40; Bid #2 Schildberg, ¾ and 1 inch, \$11.00. Commissioner Holstine made a motion to accept any and all bids presented. Commissioner Gordon seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Randy Mendenhall, Snyder and Associates, presented a contract for approval from the Big Tarkio Drainage District levee repair project. He also presented a change order for Corning Levee District's levee construction project. Discussion was held on Levee District #15, which is set to bid for construction work on January 3, 2013. This is the last of the levee repair projects to get underway since the flooding in 2011.

Commissioners then took up 2013 lumber bids as follow: Bid #1, McIntire Lumber, \$12,645; Bid #2, Midwest Service and Sales, \$8,298.96. Commissioner Gordon made a motion to accept the low bid from Midwest Service and Sales. Commissioner Holstine seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Commissioners took up 2013 Corrugated Metal Pipe (CMP) bids as follow: Bid #1 – Metal Culverts is voided and replaced – having been un-opened and removed prior to the close of bids. Bid #2, Viebrock Sales; Bid #3, Metal Culverts. After review, Commissioner Gordon made a motion to accept the low bid for all variety of pipe dimension, grade and length from Metal Culverts. Commissioner Holstine seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Commissioner Holstine shall be vacating his position on the Community Services Board effective January 1, 2013. Commissioner Holstine made a motion to appoint David Carroll, Commissioner-elect, to the board position. Commissioner Gordon seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Commissioners then took up budget requests for Transportation of Handicapped at \$1,750; Children's Mercy Hospital at \$4,000; and Northwest Child Advocacy at \$1,000. After discussion, Commissioner Holstine made a motion to pay the requested amounts for 2013. Commissioner Gordon seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Sheriff Scott Wedlock, Southern Fire Protection District Fire Chief Troy Cotton, and Mound City Rural Fire District Fire Chief JR Rother joined the commission to discuss 911 dispatch issues. Discussion was held on recent concerns with dispatch staff's training and policy and procedures for handling fire calls. Mr. Cotton and Mr. Rother reported that dispatch has, on occasion, sent a sheriff's deputy to check out a fire call before dispatching the volunteer fire departments. They also reported lengthy delays in dispatch, concerns over the steady turnover of employees in the dispatch center, and a general lack of training. Each fire chief presented a letter to the commission asking for better training and a remedy to the current situation.

Sheriff Wedlock noted that at \$8.50 per hour he cannot attract or retain dispatch staff. He agreed that fires should be dispatched promptly and that a deputy is not needed to validate those calls.

Mr. Rother asked that road closure notifications and weather alerts be a priority. Both items were previously part of dispatch notices, but are

lacking lately. Mr. Cotton suggested that 911 be split from the jail duties for better coverage. Discussion was also held on the use of paper maps, the county's graph and grid plan for address assignments and the fact that the 911 dispatch is not using the previously purchased GIS mapping data with addresses. Sheriff Wedlock noted internet problems prohibit his use of the GIS mapping.

In a related issue, County Clerk Kathy J. Kunkel stated there is no statutory obligation for the county clerk to be involved in 911 and therefore she formally resigns from any involvement in the 911 addressing or mapping system. She presented a letter to the commission noting that she, nor her office, will be involved in the development or maintenance of the 911 system.

Sheriff Wedlock reminded the commission that he is, in fact, the sheriff and not a 911 coordinator, and that Holt County is unique in that 911 dispatch is shared with jail administration. Holt County's dispatchers are also jailers, responsible for a myriad of duties including cooking, the keep and care of prisoners, warrants and clerical duties. They are generally understaffed, underpaid and overworked.

Commissioners discussed re-starting an oversight committee made up of users of the 911 system that would have a responsibility to manage the system, its components, policy and procedure. Commissioner Sitherwood stated the committee should be re-started at the first of the year.

To solve short-term issues, Sheriff Wedlock suggested adding a dispatch position from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. on weekdays to help alleviate strain on dispatchers over two meals at the jail as well as court processing, visitation and daily duties. Commissioners agreed.

Being no further business, the commission adjourned until Monday, December 17, 2012.

The Holt County Commission met Monday, December 17, 2012, at 9:00 a.m. with Presiding Commissioner Mark Sitherwood, First District Commissioner Bill Gordon and Second District Commissioner Don Holstine present.

Bill Metzgar, rural Mound City, approached the commission to report that he has completed work on areas of the roadway which were holding water. He requested the county provide a load of rock to the area south of the bridge as soon as possible to keep the roadway from further deteriorating. Road and Bridge Supervisor Daryl Biermann joined the discussion and agreed to schedule the work, weather permitting.

Mr. Biermann also reported on final work at BRO-31, a bridge replacement on Holt Road 170. A bridge opening was scheduled for Monday, January 7, 2013, at 11:30 a.m.

Brenda Nelson, R.N., Health Department Administrator, approached the commission to give an update on matters of her department. She reported that satellite telephone service is once again available for emergency measures. Commissioners agreed with Mrs. Nelson that the service is not necessary.

Commissioners then took up review of 2013 Budget figures with County Clerk Kathy J. Kunkel. Mrs. Kunkel requested the commission increase the mileage per diem paid by the county from the current \$0.40 per mile to something greater. She suggested \$0.45 or \$0.50 per mile with the federal rate being \$0.56 ½ for 2013. Commissioners tabled the request.

Being no further business, the commission adjourned until Friday, December 21, 2012.

Road and Bridge Supervisor Daryl Biermann joined the commission to review the Road and Bridge Budget requests for 2013.

4th District State Representative Mike Thomson joined the commission to discuss the upcoming legislative session.

Being no further business, the commission adjourned until Friday, December 28, 2012.

The Holt County Commission met Friday, December 28, 2012, at 9:00 a.m. with Presiding Commissioner Mark Sitherwood, First District Commissioner Bill Gordon and Second District Commissioner Don Holstine present. Second District Commissioner-Elect David Carroll was also in attendance.

Pat O'Malley, representing Exide Technologies, requested information about closing a segment of Exide Road northeast of 111 Highway to allow for more controlled access to the plant. After discussion, commissioners believed there would be opposition from neighbors and landowners in the area to the closure and suggested a petition process to formally close the road would not be successful. Mr. O'Malley agreed to look for alternate remedies.

Commissioners then took up review of 2013 budget documents with Budget Officer and County Clerk Kathy J. Kunkel.

Being no further business, the commission adjourned until Monday, December 31, 2012.

The Holt County Commission met Monday, December 31, 2012, at 9:00 a.m. with Presiding Commissioner Mark Sitherwood, First District Commissioner Bill Gordon and Second District Commissioner Don Holstine present. Second District Commissioner-Elect David Carroll was also in attendance.

Assessor Carla Markt appeared before the commission to discuss transition over the next nine months in her office. Under Missouri law, Mrs. Markt will continue to be the assessor until September 1, 2013. Mrs. Markt requested the county continue to fund her attendance to the Missouri River Recovery and Implementation Committee (MRRIC), where she is a congressionally-appointed member representing rural communities, local government and agricultural interests related to the US Army Corps of Engineers' management of the Missouri River. Commissioners had previously agreed to cover her expenses to attend the meetings and further agreed to do so in the coming year. In other matters, she discussed insurance coverage and the need for more space in her office area to accommodate staff and the public.

Brenda Nelson, R.N., Health Department Administrator, joined the commission to discuss ongoing work in her department. She also reported a problem with a door lock and that Buildings and Grounds Supervisor Mike Brock will take care of the repairs.

Tye Parsons and Joseph Reimer, Northwest Regional Council of Governments (NWRCOG), approached the commission to present a contract for the management of Holt County's floodplain requirements. Presiding Commissioner Mark Sitherwood has held the post of Floodplain Coordinator since taking office in 2007; however, with multiple tasks required of him, the county sought assistance from NWRCOG to do substantial damage estimates after the 2011 flooding. After discussion, Commissioner Holstine made a motion to retain NWRCOG to serve as Holt County's Floodplain Administrators for a sum of \$4,000 per year. Commissioner Gordon seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.
