Filing dates coming up for school board and municipal seats

Filing for municipal and school board elections starts Tuesday, Dec. 16, and continues until Tuesday, Jan. 20. Elections will take place on Tuesday, April 7. The open positions are as follows:

Mound City R-2 School Board

Two board member positions for a three-year term are up for election. Filing will take place at the superintendent's office at 708 Nebraska Street, Mound City. The office will be open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., though the school will be closed starting Friday, Dec. 19, at 12:30 p.m. School will reopen on Monday, Jan. 5, 2015. The office may be open during the break, but those interested in filing should call first at 660-442-3737. The office will also be closed on Monday, Jan. 19, 2015, in observance of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.

Craig R-3 School Board

Two board positions for a three-year term as well as one board position for the remaining two years of a vacated term are up for election. Filing begins at the Craig superintendent's office at 402 N. Ward, Craig, MO, on Tuesday, Dec. 16, at 8 a.m.. Filing will end at 5 p.m., Tuesday, Jan. 20. Regular office hours are 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, though the office will be closed from Monday, Dec. 22, through Friday, Jan. 2, and on Monday, Jan. 19.

South Holt R-1 School Board

Two board member positions for a three-year term are up for election. Filing begins at 8 a.m., on Tuesday, Dec. 16, at the superintendent's office at 201 S. Barbour in Oregon, MO. Filing will end at 5 p.m., Tuesday, Jan. 20. Regular office hours are 8 a.m. to

4 p.m., Monday through Friday. Due to the Christmas holidays, the office will close at 1 p.m. on Dec. 19, and will not reopen until Jan. 5. The office will not be open for filings on days when school is canceled or dismissed early for inclement weather.

Nodaway-Holt R-7 School Board

Great improvements coming to Big Lake State Park

Bill Bryan, the director of Missouri State Parks, recently announced that Big Lake State Park will be receiving approximately \$800,000 for park improvements in the upcoming year. The funding comes from general revenue appropriated by the Missouri General Assembly during the 2013 legislative session.

"Prior to flooding in 2011, Big Lake State Park served as a vacation destination for those who enjoy the many recreation opportunities the area has to offer," said Bryan. "We re-opened the campground in 2014 and were met with an enthusiastic response from the community and visitors. We're excited to be bringing additional amenities to Big Lake State Park so even more guests can enjoy the park."

According to Bryan, the goal is to complete construction of eight full service camper cabins, make improvements to the campground, replace shower houses and restrooms and install two playgrounds before June 30, 2015. It is believed this will be achievable with little to no interruption to park visitors in the interim.

Construction will soon begin on the cabins. These camper cabins will have electricity, air conditioning, heat, a small kitchen and shower and are expected to open during

the summer of 2015.

Missouri State Parks also plans to replace the campground electrical pedestals and upgrade 10 of the existing electric sites to 50-amp sites. Additional work at the park will include the new shower houses to replace old or damaged facilities, the replacement of the playgrounds and a new vault toilet.

The Big Lake Improvement Association is also offering the association's facilities to Big Lake State Park for reunions, receptions and so forth. This will make a nice amenity for park guests.

Missouri State Parks and the Big Lake Improvement Association are looking forward to working together on upcoming events such as a cardboard regatta, 5K fun run, clean-up projects, and more.

Women, Infant and Children (WIC) is a nutrition education, health promotion, and supplemental nutrition program to assist women, infants, and children who have nutritional needs and are at financial risk. The WIC program promotes breastfeeding.

Benefits of WIC provided at no cost include:

- Nutrition education and personalized nutritional counseling
- Health screening, education, and referrals to health care
- Risk assessment
- Checks to buy supplemental nutritious food
- Breastfeeding education and support
- Breast pumps for WIC breastfeeding mothers who qualify
- If eligible, receipt of up to 3 months of checks per visit to buy nutritious food to supplement the diet, such as milk, cheese, infant formula, baby food, iron-fortified cereal, eggs, fruits, vegetables.

Pregnant women are counted as two family members. WIC encourages eligible pregnant women to enroll in the early months of pregnancy. WIC encourages the enrollment of migrants. Income guidelines are based on 185% of poverty level.

Fourth Circuit Presiding Judge sits with Supreme Court of Missouri

Judge Roger M. Prokes, presiding judge of the Fourth Judicial Circuit (Atchison, Gentry, Holt, Nodaway and Worth counties) sat with the Supreme Court of Missouri Tuesday morning, Dec. 2, by special designation. Prokes was sitting in place of Judge Zel M. Fischer, who was recused.

“Judge Prokes was a welcome colleague on the Court for oral arguments today,” Chief Justice Mary R. Russell said. “We are fortunate to have judges from all levels of the court system so talented and willing to assist when the Court needs special judges to sit due to recusals or the absence of our judges.”

Prokes heard three cases on the Court’s Dec. 2 docket. The first, Case No. SC94085, *City of Moline Acres v. Charles W. Brennan*, was an appeal from St. Louis County involving the validity of a local automated traffic camera enforcement system for speeding tickets. The second two both involved the validity of a local automated traffic camera system for red light tickets: SC94379, *City of St. Peters, Mis-*

souri v. Bonnie A. Roeder, an appeal from St. Charles County, and SC94212, *Sarah Tupper, et al. v. City of St. Louis, et al.*, an appeal from St. Louis city.

Prokes has served as the circuit’s presiding judge since Jan., 2001. He was elected circuit judge in Nov., 2000, and was re-elected in 2006 and 2012. Prior to that, he was engaged in a general law practice in northwest Missouri for 24 years. Prokes also formerly served as an assistant professor of business law and an adjunct professor of education law at Northwest Missouri State University in Maryville. He is a member of the executive committees of both the presiding judges’ association and the circuit judges’ association.

In March, 2014, Prokes received the Advanced Science and Technology Adjudication Resource (ASTAR) award after completing 120 hours of court-related science and technology classes designed to help trial judges understand the unique details of certain complex evidence presented in court. As an ASTAR judge, Prokes is avail-



able to hear specialized cases throughout Missouri.

Originally from Nebraska, Prokes earned both his bachelor of science in business administration and his law degree from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Health insurance open enrollment for 2014-2015

The annual enrollment period for health insurance is now open. The three-month window, during which Missourians can apply for, change or renew health insurance coverage for 2015, is here. Missourians need to act now because open enrollment season lasts only half as long as last year’s period.

Missourians who signed up for health insurance under the Affordable Care Act last year are set up for an automatic renewal of their health

insurance plan. Before accepting that renewal, Certified Application Counselors (CACs) encourage the insured party to check and see if options have changed, as there may be lower-premium options now available through the exchange, and to be assured of an updated plan.

Given this year’s shortened enrollment window, individuals who want to enroll in a new or different plan, and who want their coverage to take effect January 1, 2015, need to enroll by December 15, 2014, to avoid a lapse in coverage.

Northwest Health Services has CACs who can help consumers avoid some of the headaches, hassles and confusion that come with open enrollment. For assistance

MU Extension and USDA Farm Service Agency to host Farm Bill meeting

The Agricultural Act of 2014 (2014 Farm Bill) repeals certain programs, continues some programs with modifications, and authorizes several new programs administered by the Farm Service Agency (FSA). Most of these programs are authorized and funded through 2018, according to the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency.

The 2014 Farm Bill contains several provisions that enable farmers and landowners to make decisions regarding their involvement in federal farm programs. Landowners will have the opportunity to reallocate base acres on individual farms as well as update yield information that is used to determine some farm program payments. Additionally, farmers will have the opportunity to elect to participate in the new

commodity programs - Price Loss Coverage and Agriculture Risk Coverage.

To provide information on the new Farm Bill and assist landowners and farmers in making program decisions, University of Missouri (MU) Extension and USDA Farm Service Agency will host a meeting in Mound City on Wednesday, Dec. 17, from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. in the Extreme Fireworks Building.

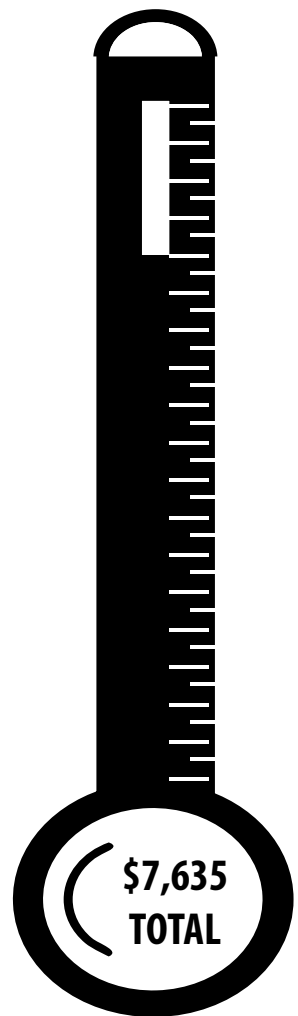

This Week's History

From the *Mound City News* archives

50 Years Ago - 1964

- The Mound City Chamber of Commerce sponsored a Christmas parade that attracted a large crowd to Mound City. The parade was led by Mound City's marching band. Following the parade, an auction was held at the 4-Way Snack Bar parking lot, with Abie Showalter being the auctioneer. The auction was sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Mound City. Donated articles netted almost \$170, and the club asked for the assistance and advice of the Holt County Welfare Department in supplying an appropriate Christmas for approximately one dozen needy families in the area.

- The era of long Saturday nights in small towns had changed greatly during recent years. The old attraction had apparently given way to other forms of entertainment made available by good roads, faster cars and television. Mound City's three grocery stores announced that they would start closing at 8 p.m. on the last day of each week, instead of the one hour later time, which had been in effect for several years. Many other businesses in Mound City would probably "follow suit" soon.

25 Years Ago - 1989

- The Holt County Sheriff's Department had an unidentified body as of Sunday afternoon. While hunting rabbits along the Burlington Northern right-of-way three miles east of the Rulo Bridge, Joe Godfirmon, Bigelow, and companions came upon a body near the tracks. The individual was believed to have either fallen from the train or possibly been hit by it.

- Rick Barnes cut the ribbon during open house activities at Barnes Realty on State Street. The establishment had just completed a remodeling of its building, inside and out, featuring a red barn effect.

- Dean Johnson, secretary-manager of the Farmers Mutual Fire and Lightning Insurance Co. in Mound City, was the 1989 recipient of the Chairman's Award presented by the Missouri Association of Mutual Insurance Companies. Johnson was also elected chairman-elect of the statewide organization.

- Due to scheduling conflicts, the Panthers were not able to participate in the Savannah Tournament. Instead they would participate in the Nodaway County Tournament in Maryville.

10 Years Ago - 2004

- Area members of the eight-man all-state football team were: First Team - Dylan Rosier, Mound City; Travis Milne, Luke Buntz, Adam Slusher and Aaron Plummer, South Holt; Second Team - Ryan Sharp, Mound City; Nate Jeter and Derek Derr, Nodaway-Holt; and Shane Anderson and Adam Slusher, South Holt.

- Mound City city workers filled in a hole they dug on 5th Street in the storm sewer that ran past the building on the corner of State and 5th Street. The sewer was scanned with a video camera as Pam Smith, owner of the building, had long claimed that the basement water problems were caused by the sewer. GRL Contracting of Richmond told city workers that the sewer was full of cracks.

- Another 138 acres of land was added to the Monkey Mountain Conservation Area at the southeast tip of Holt County. The area already included 787 acres, most of it heavily wooded and in steep hills, including seven ponds. The addition put it at 925 acres. Other Holt County conservation areas included Bob Brown, Nodaway Valley, Riverbreaks, Thurnau and McCormack conservation areas.

COTTONWOOD SCHOOL

Can anyone assist with student names in this undated photo in society files? Cottonwood was a two-story country school located west of Bigelow, MO. News clippings indicated it began about 1874. There was a large attendance as many children in the bottom attended classes there. Miss Elizabeth Jones, of Bigelow, was the last teacher in 1937 when the school closed. She then went to teach at Bigelow and the students were all transported into town.

There is a lot of interest in Holt County country schools! Especially class rosters and locations. Researchers seeking ancestors are excited when they find a child's name in a country school record book on the center shelves. A planned 2015 spring project at the Genealogy and Research Center is to sort, file and compile all the Holt County country school information, photos and histories to make research easily accessible. 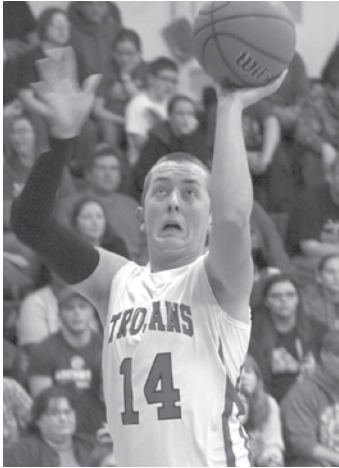

Saving Sight screens young eyes

Saving Sight (formerly Lions’ Vision) came to Mound City R-2 in Mound City on Monday, Dec. 8, for a vision screening.

The screening involved taking a scan of a child’s eyes with a Plusoptix autorefractor by a trained technician. It required no physical contact and posed no risk to the child’s health. Screening is performed from 3.3 feet (1 meter) away and takes less than one second.

The screening can detect Myopia (nearsightedness), Hyperopia (farsightedness), astigmatism (corneal irregularities), anisometropia (comparing refraction of both eyes), anisocoria (comparing pupil sizes of both eyes), corneal reflexes (symmetric eye alignment) or possible cataracts.

Many parents may not know a vision condition exists because young children are unaware of or cannot yet verbalize a “fuzzy vision.” This screening enables parents to take action on vision abnormalities even when children are too young to communicate a problem.

The grades participating in the screening were preschool, kindergarten and first grade. The screening was also available to children six months to six years not enrolled in school.

According to Mound City R-2 student health services director, Cindy Klass, RN, this screening is a “wonderful opportunity for the community and students.” Several non-district children came to the screening.

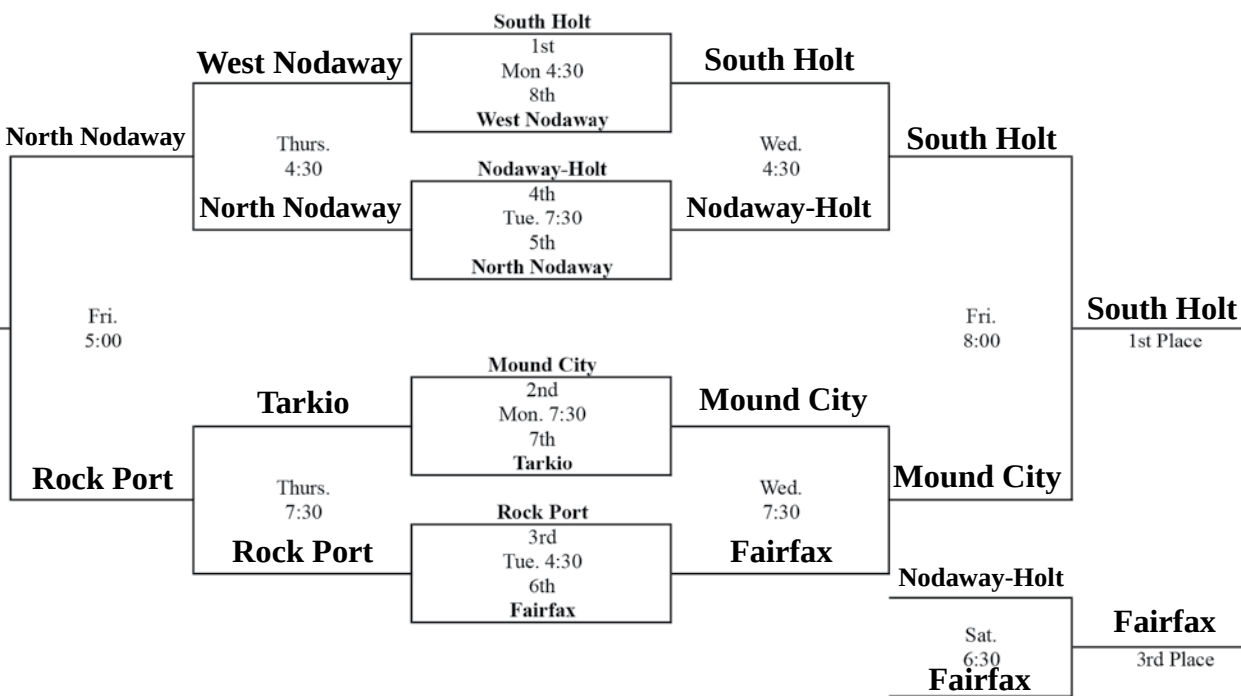

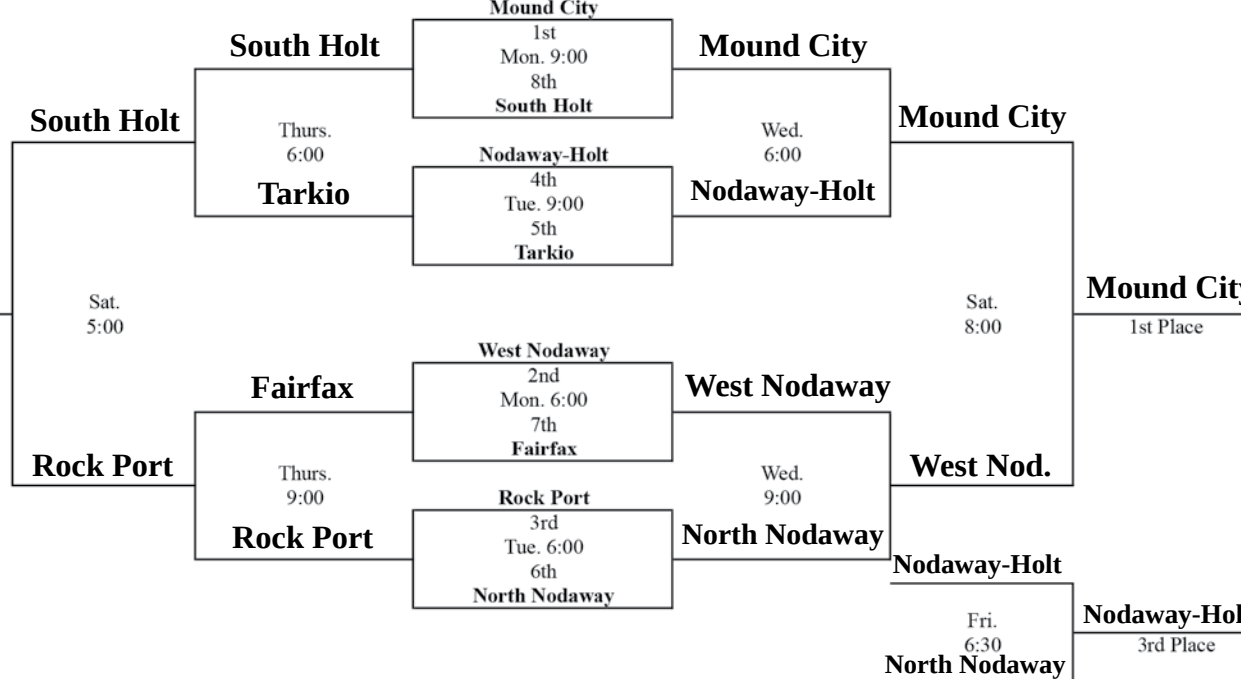

Snow blower safety starts up before the snow blower powers up

According to weather forecasters, the winter of 2014-15 will see below-normal temperatures for about three-quarters of the nation. That means snow blowers could be getting a workout this winter. The Outdoor Power Equipment Institute (OPEI) offers the following safety tips to assist homeowners, contractors and business owners as snow removal equipment is powered up.

Make sure the snow blower is in good working order, before the first flakes fall. Change the oil. Install a new spark plug and inspect the belts to be sure they are in good working order. If the fuel was not drained the last winter before storing the snow blower, drain the tank now. Check the auger (always in the “off” position) and adjust any cables. Make sure the snow blower starts.

Review the owner’s manual. Read and review safe handling procedures from the manufacturer.

Before it snows, clear the pathways that are intended for use. Snow can sometimes hide objects that might clog the chute of a snow blower, or cause damage to the machine or people nearby. Remove doormats, sleds, boards, wires, and other debris from the pathways that will be cleared.

Use the right fuel. It is important to have the proper fuel on hand, as filling stations may be closed if there is a power outage after a snowstorm. Store fuel properly and buy the type of fuel recommended by the equipment’s manufacturer. It is illegal to use any fuel with more than 10% ethanol content in outdoor power equipment (for more information on fueling properly see www.LookBeforeYouPump.com).

Handle fuel carefully. Use non-spill containers with spouts. Fill up the fuel tank outside before starting the engine and while the engine is cold.

Never add fuel to a running or hot engine. Store fuel in a clean, dry, ventilated area, and never near a pilot light, stove, or heat source. Never smoke around fuel.

Dress properly for the job. Wear adequate winter garments and footwear that can handle slippery surfaces. Put on safety glasses, and avoid loose fitting clothing that could get caught in moving parts. Tie back long hair.

Operate the snow blower in visible conditions. Never operate the snow blower without good visibility or light.

Aim carefully and avoid people and cars. Never throw snow toward people or cars. Do not allow anyone to stand in front of the snow blower. Keep children or pets away from the snow blower when it is operating.

Use extreme caution on slopes and hills. Do not clear snow across the face of slopes. Be cautious when changing directions on slopes. Do not attempt to clear steep slopes.

Turn OFF the snow blower to clear a clog or repair it. If the machine has to be repaired, remove debris or unclog built up snow and always turn off the snow blower. Wait for all moving parts to come to a complete stop. Disconnect the spark plug wire or power cord.

KEY SAFETY TIP: Never put hands inside the auger or chute. Use a clean out tool (or stick) to unclog wet snow or debris from the snow blower. Hands should never go inside the auger or chute.

Know where the cord is. If it is an electric powered snow blower, be aware of where the power cord is at all times. Avoid tripping. Do not run over the power cord.

Prevent insects from infesting stored grain

As corn yields exceed commercial storage space, farmers will likely store some of this year’s crop in on-farm bins and in unconventional ways.

Stored grain attracts insects, and producers should take measures to protect their investment from insect damage, says Wayne Bailey, University of Missouri Extension entomologist.

First, remove grain residues from bins, nearby bunks or feed storage areas, Bailey says. Sanitize empty bins, combines, trucks and augers, paying special atten-

tion to fans, with pre-harvest insecticide applications. For best results, apply to empty bin surfaces and surrounding areas six to eight weeks before harvest.

Use a coarse spray of at least 30 psi to spray areas until wet. Insecticides are most effective when temperatures are 60 degrees or higher.

Second, apply a labeled protectant surface spray on grain to be stored. Streams of grain are usually treated as they flow into storage structures.

This is essential for grain that will be in storage through the summer months or longer, Bailey says. Long storage periods increase risk of infestation.

Make a second application of insecticide on the top layer of grain. Fill bins only to the height of sidewalls and level grain before topdressing. This helps prevent invading insects, especially Indian meal moth, from entering grain beneath the top surface. Bailey also suggests hanging pest strips in the bin above the grain to control moths.

Third, monitor stored grain for pests. Bailey recommends monthly visual checks from the roof access door from November through April, and checking at least twice a month from May through October. The surface and the central core of the grain are most often infested, but sample other areas also.

A sour smell indicates a problem. There may also be clumped grain or condensation on the inside of the bin, webbing on the grain surface or the presence of insect larvae, adult beetles or moths.

Do not walk on the top layer of treated grain. In addition to being a safety risk, this may crack open areas for insects to enter. Monitor grain on the inside of the bin by using plastic tube traps, probe traps or

pheromone traps. Insert these to attract insects and determine the kind and number of insects present. If these traps are unavailable, look at grain that has been removed with a grain probe from the side door.

Soybean is at less risk of infestation than corn if moisture is maintained at 13 to 14 percent, Bailey said. This is because soybean has high oil content. Infestation happens in as little as three to six weeks if bins and equipment are not sanitized prior to grain fill, he said.

In normal years, fall temperatures usually allow the stored grain mass to cool to 50 to 55 degrees. This causes insects infesting the grain to become inactive. Some grain management recommendations suggest reducing the temperature of the grain mass to 35 to 40 degrees to restrict the development of molds.

Grain should not be frozen when reducing grain-mass temperature in the fall. During periods of warm fall weather, the risk of late-season insect infestations of stored grain increases. In the spring, the grain mass should be warmed to at least 60 degrees to prevent condensation of moisture on bin walls and subsequent damage from insects and molds.

If infestation is observed, quit feeding the grain to livestock immediately.

All applications should be performed by a licensed pesticide applicator. However, Bailey recommends using a professional pest control specialist to fumigate bins and other grain storage structures because of the hazards associated with poisonous gases emitted during fumigation.

Farm Service Agency microloan cap grows to \$50,000

Missouri Farm Service Agency (FSA) State Executive Director, Mark Cadle, reminds farmers and ranchers that the FSA borrowing limit for microloans increased from \$35,000 to \$50,000. Microloans offer borrowers simplified lending with less paperwork. Cadle said it makes borrowing from FSA a "first opportunity" to farm or ranch or quickly expand existing operations.

"This will help more people because of new flexibilities created by the 2014 Farm Bill," Cadle said. "We're especially excited in Missouri, because we want to encourage more beginners and young people, especially those from historically underserved communities, to consider farming and ranching as a way to become independent businessmen and women. It's a rewarding way to build or expand a family operation."

The microloan change allows beginning, small and mid-sized farmers to access an additional \$15,000 in loans using a simplified application process with up to seven years to repay. Microloans are part of United States

Department of Agriculture's (USDA's) continued commitment to small and midsized farming operations.

To complement the microloan program additional changes to FSA eligibility requirements will enhance beginning farmers and ranchers access to land, a key barrier to entry level producers. FSA policies related to farm experience have changed so that other types of skills may be considered to meet the direct farming experience required for farm ownership loan eligibility. Operation or management of non-farm businesses, leadership positions while serving in the military or advanced education in an agricultural field will now count towards the experience applicants need to show when applying for farm ownership loans.

Since 2010, FSA has made a record amount of farm loans — more than 165,000 loans totaling nearly \$23 billion. More than 50 percent of USDA's farm loans now go to beginning farmers. In addition, FSA has increased its lending to socially-disadvantaged producers by nearly 50 percent since 2010.

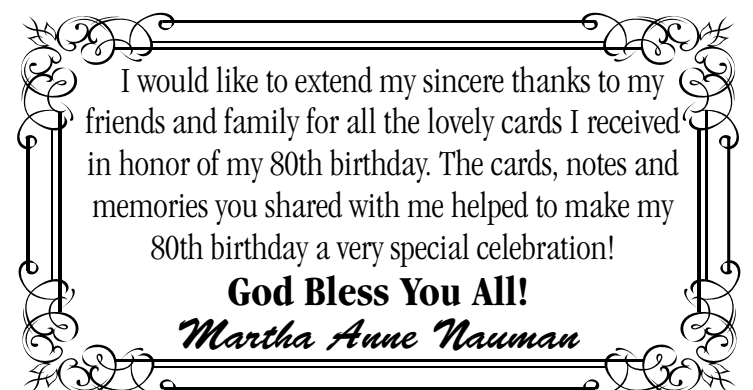
