



Things to think about

I've now been in Mound City for over three years. Since arriving, I have come to know the town and Holt County fairly well. Between community events, Kiwanis, and other social events, I have seen the tremendous upside to living in a small, tight knit community. It is wonderful to have a nice grocery store, three convenience stores, a pharmacy, many restaurants, stores, car dealerships and many more businesses (I could go on and on). Many small towns our size would be envious to have the local businesses that we have.

Three years ago, when I decided to make newspapering my career choice, I was looking at several different weekly newspapers to purchase. I chose Mound City for a few reasons: 1. The nice people I knew before coming to town encouraged me; 2. It was close to home; and 3. The newspaper was very well operated, plus, I like small towns. I believe there is nothing better than to be able to drive across town in minutes - not hours. I have chosen to make Mound City my home and plan to be here until Tiffany Heights kicks me out. I want to help Mound City and all of Holt County to prosper in the future.

Since I came to town, my parents decided to sell the two newspapers they owned for many years, the Tarkio Avalanche and Fairfax Forum. After much research, my dad and I decided there was a need for a commercial web printing operation in the area. This helps serve as Dad's semi-retirement job while Mom is helping at the newspaper part-time. I wouldn't have invested/borrowed money for this expansion to the newspaper business if I didn't believe that this investment was solid and good for the area. This new business expansion brings new dollars into the county, adds a few new jobs, and possibly, in the future, brings a new family or two to town.

Just take a look at what positive things have happened in Mound City the past few years. We have had a few small businesses come to town. We have seen businesses and people investing in Mound City. Recently new awnings have been added to Rogers Pharmacy, a Main Street building is being converted into apartments and office space, and current businesses are expanding - just to name a few.

In comparsion, look at Atchison County. In the last decade, Atchison County has seen its ups and downs. After the closure of Tarkio College in 1993, county residents got together and decided that a full-time economic development office was needed. The Atchison County Development Corp., a volunteer group of citizens, had seen many projects slip through the cracks because of volunteers not being able to "follow through" with project leads, etc.

After passing a county-wide sales tax to support economic development, Atchison County has been able to boast about new wind farms, a huge grain elevator, business expansions, a new grocery store, Dollar General, Subway, a new restaurant, data center expansions and more. Atchison County has implemented a county-wide enterprise zone as well as other tax abatement programs that have helped entice new businesses for the county. The county has had hundreds of windmills bring hundreds of thousands of tax dollars to the county, and many new jobs as did the new grain elevator.

What I'd like to provoke is some critical thinking on how Holt County can compete in the next century for new jobs that might keep some of our young people around.

We need to ask ourselves this: What are we doing to help this area grow?

I don't have all the answers, but I do know this: With every new business that comes into our area, the tax base increases; and with every new home and every new job comes an increased tax base. If our population base continues to drop, we will have to continue to ask fewer people to pay more just to maintain what we have today. I'm not big in asking for tax increases, but I do believe in investing money now that will save me, and everyone else, money in the long run.

I have heard quite a few very good, progressive ideas. We need to seriously look at these ideas and take them into consideration. Think about the future and where we want this area to be when the younger generation takes

Mound City has one of the highest performing school districts in northwest Missouri. We have an excellent staff, administration and board who all continue to think toward the future. The future is in the quality of our education for our youth - we all know that. The statement should never be 'it's working, so why should we fix it'. If we aren't forward thinking about ways to improve and streamline our educational system, as well as our business community, we will always be moving backwards.

June bridges to be rebuilt include: the 1956 bridge over the old channel of the Big Tarkio River on Highway 111 south of Craig slated for June 6, and the 1947 bridge over the Minnesota Valley Creek on Route C east of Route N north of Mound City slated for replacement on June 27.

The 1954 bridge on Route B, northeast of Oregon, over Lincoln Creek (near the other two bridge replacements to be done in April) is scheduled for replacement on July 25.

On August 1, the bridge north of Mound City over the Mid Branch of Squaw Creek, located on Route C, just east of Route N, will begin to be rebuilt. It was originally built in 1955.

Two bridges are scheduled to be rebuilt beginning in September. The first is the 1949 bridge over Wildcat Creek, north of Mound City on Route C, west of Route N, slated for September 6. The second is the 1955 Squaw Creek bridge on Route C, near the junction of Route DD. The replacement project is scheduled for September 26.

The 13th and final bridge in Holt County to begin reconstruction on October 17 will be the 1956 bridge over Cannon Creek on Highway 111 north of Forest City, MO.



This one-lane bridge- East of Craig, MO, over the Little Tarkio Creek, is scheduled to be replaced in May of this year. It is one of 13 bridges in Holt County that are slated for replacement through the MoDOT Safe & Sound Bridge Improvement Program.

The dates listed are projected start dates for KTU Constructors to begin the work, with the construction period expected to last approximately six to eight weeks per bridge.

While the result of these much needed projects will serve as great improvements for both Holt County residents and travelers through

the area, the detours may prove difficult for residents and farmers during the spring planting season and the fall harvest season.




