Don Hall

Don Hall - A salute to a Mound City businessman

Don Hall, 87, is a lifelong native of rural northwest Missouri, working on his father's farm and in the family orchard while growing up in Forbes, MO. He is the oldest of seven children of the late Clarence and Hazel Hall.

Don joined the U.S. Army after graduation from Oregon, MO, High School in 1945, and attended South Dakota State in Billings, SD, while taking Army Specialized Training with an emphasis on engineering and was later stationed at Fort Richardson near Anchorage, AK. After an honorable discharge from the army, Don received a Bachelor of Science degree in Agriculture from the University of Missouri in 1950 and was inducted into Gamma Sigma Delta and Alpha Zeta, the Honor Society of Agriculture fraternities.

Don owned Mound City Implement Company, a John Deere dealership, from 1951 to 1961 and moved the dealership from the south end of Mound City to the north end. He also owned a Pontiac/GMC dealership during that time and purchased a grain elevator with his family, Hall Farms, in Forbes, that later became D and L Grain, owned by Don and his son, Larry.

In 1960, Don was elected mayor of Mound City. During his tenure, the swimming pool was built from the sale of bonds. Don states that the pool could never have been built without

Mound City Nutrition Site makes its money count

"Katheryn's shoes were difficult to fill, but Debbie has stepped right into them."

The Holt County Senior Citizens' Fund group also traveled to Maitland, MO, to hand over a distribution check to the site's director, Nancy Diggs.

Mound City Rural Fire District depends on volunteers to get the job done

The Mound City Rural Fire District covers Mound City, Bigelow, MO, Big Lake, MO, Fortescue, MO, and the surrounding areas, encompassing a vast number of square miles and acres. The district is staffed by volunteers that have been trained to fight fires, extricate victims and rush into burning buildings. These volunteers do not get paid for these services. Most of them must leave a job when the fire radio sounds the alarm.

At Hiawatha Implement, four employees are volunteers with the district. Three of them are salaried and clock out while on a fire call. Of course, they can't leave if busy with work, but many times, the paycheck reflects the time off taken to fight a fire. Chris Krueger, Greg Biermann and Matt Stiens are local residents that work at Hiawatha Implement and also go out on fire calls. Another employee, Clayton Townsend, is a Fillmore, MO, resident. Townsend is a member of the Fillmore Fire Department but volunteers his expertise during the workday when a fire call comes across the radio.

The district's Fire Chief is J.R. Rother of Mound City. Rother also works for Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT). Unless he is working on a job out of town, Rother

makes it to most fires. He uses vacation time and personal days when clocked out for the fires. This definitely cuts into Rother's time with his family, but firefighting is a family tradition. J.R.'s late father, Robert, was a volunteer on the Rural Fire Department for many years.

Rother reports that the Mound City Rural Fire District has 23 members on the roster, but it is usually the same six to eight volunteers that make it to the fire calls. Several members work out of town and several more members are farmers that can't get away from the field in a timely fashion. For bigger, more time consuming fires, more members respond but the majority of the calls are handled by relatively few. The volunteers estimate that fire calls take less than two to three hours a week away from regular work hours with no calls out on some weeks.

Rother states that many fires occur in the spring when dry

Remembering

"Voting and Taxes." These are probably the two most important words that determine our everyday lives. Can you remember your first time doing each one? Maybe you have never voted, but I know you have paid taxes or you wouldn't by reading this, at least not around here. You know the old saying, only two things are certain - taxes and death. Betty and I never worried much, when growing up, about politics and voting. Those two things didn't mean much to us. During World War II (WWII), I and a lot of others didn't have a chance to vote anyway. Many in the war were not old enough to vote and not too many were making enough money to have to pay taxes. Betty was raised a Republican and I was raised a Democrat, but we were both raised to try and vote for the best person. How can you do that today? Back then, we weren't badgered continually for votes and especially for money, like now. I switched to the other party in a primary to help a friend who asked for our votes. I remember I was told, "That's not your party." I said ves it is, this time, but I changed back the next time. For the last 30 years I've been of the same party as Betty so we didn't cancel out each other's votes.

Betty and I really never started voting until I was through with WWII and Korea and we had to quit farming. I went to work with the Michigan-Wisconsin Pipeline and we moved to town. The company encouraged everyone to get involved in local and community affairs, which we did. We got more involved in the church, I became a scoutmaster; and Betty became a Cub Scout den mother. Betty was the city clerk for several years; and we joined the Parent Teachers' Association (PTA), Masons, Eastern Star, etc., making us more conscience of politics and how much it began taking over our lives, making voting more important than ever. I think back then we could believe most of what we were told would take place and what already had. I don't believe much anymore. There is now a movement from the higher-ups to make voting mandatory for everyone. To me, to vote is a privilege, a duty and an honor to volunteer on my own. So, if this does happen, I'm going to fall back and be a typical stubborn Missourian and not do it. Also, going to work for Michigan-Wisconsin Pipeline made it possible to take out health insurance for our family of five. It was not mandatory then, but an optional benefit, with \$4.95 per month with John Hancock Insurance Company taken out of my paycheck, along with a retirement account to be paid into and our federal and state income tax taken out. We never had to pay much income tax back with farming due to bad crop years, low livestock prices, interest on loans and a lot of things were exempt from taxation. I wonder what

George Washington and his followers would think of all these taxes today? If anyone can come up with one item that is not taxed now it will be because it was missed. With all the shortcomings our country has, the only thing that can

be done is to raise the existing taxes and keep raising.

It is good to live in a small town and rural area where a national voter's ID isn't needed, like elsewhere where it's needed. It has been found in some parts of the country that people have voted more than once and have names from a cemetery where the persons whose names were used have been gone for several years. The voting percentage is way too low; but more would vote if the one we send to Washington would represent us, out in the districts, as they are supposed to do. Whoever is there, regardless of what is done about the existing debts and borrowing to keep going and the waste that normally goes with it all, can never make us back into what our country stood for. Some people are lucky and can remember and wish it was that way again - independent and free to choose (sometimes anyway). If you can remember, tell your families how it was...if they'll listen. Good luck.




Skidmore man injured when car crashes into house

A replica of the First Presbyterian Church of Craig, MO, was crafted by the late Frank Gates of Craig, in 1955. It was in 1954 that a fire in the structure resulted in damages estimated at over \$23,000. Frank built the scale model building to drop donations in for the repairs and rebuilding. In March, 1955, the renovation, along with an addition with a kitchen and dining area, was completed and dedicated.

The replica, complete with tiny details, along with many clippings and articles telling the history of the church, was recently given to the Holt County Historical Society by Frank's wife, Roberta, of Craig, and his son and wife, Dennis and Sharon Gates of Shenandoah, IA. Dennis recalls attending Sunday School and worship services at the Craig School while the remodeling was being completed.

The First Presbyterian Church of Craig was organized on September 16, 1877. The edifice, a beautiful brick building, was completed on West Front Street in December of 1878, at a cost of \$3,200.

The miniature church will be displayed in the society's Methodist Church Museum in Fortescue, MO, for everyone to enjoy this summer. The gift also included many photos, news clippings and histories compiled by the Gates family that are now placed in a notebook to record that history. Sunday morning services continue at the Craig First Presbyterian Church along with fellowship gatherings and other activities.

The General Municipal Election for Holt County is scheduled for Tuesday, April 7, and voters are encouraged to cast their ballots even though there are only a few races in the county.

In the South Holt R-1 School District, three candidates (Brian Williams, Jim Kelly and Jason Kurtz) are running for two three-year board member positions.

In the Craig R-3 School District, three candidates (Rebecca Monroe, Michael Peters and Samantha Voltmer-Grist) are running for two three-year board member positions. Also in Craig, MO, two candidates (Karen Miller and Angela Woods) are seeking Position 1 for Alderman At-Large.

All other races in Holt County are uncontested or have qualified for Non-Election eligibility.

There are questions on four municipal ballots (Oregon, Village of Big Lake, Village of Bigelow and Village of Corning) asking if the municipality shall forgo annual election if the number of candidates who have filed for a particular office is equal to the number of positions in the office to be filled by the election.

Finally, the Southern Holt County Pool Neighborhood Improvement District/Southern Holt County Pool Project has a question on the ballot. "Shall Holt County, MO, be authorized to create a neighborhood improvement district proposed for the Southern Holt County Pool Project and incur indebtedness and issue general obligation bonds to pay for all or part of the cost of public improvements within such district, the cost of all indebtedness so incurred to be assessed by the governing body of Holt County, MO, on the real property benefitted

by such improvements for a period of twenty years, and if included in the resolution, an assessment in each year thereafter with the proceeds thereof used solely for maintenance of the improvement?"





25th Annual St. Francis **Golf Benefit announced**

Tobins to host final tournament

Back for its silver anniversary, the Tobin Benefit Golf Classic is legendary in Maryville and the Northwest Missouri region. The St. Francis Hospital Foundation fundraiser, better known as "The Tobin", has been hosted by Vince, Bill and Duke Tobin, along with the extended Tobin family, over the years; however, 2015 will be the final year for The Tobin.

"It is with mixed emotions," said Vince Tobin, on speaking about making the 25th year the final Tobin Classic. "We want to end this on a high note, and hope more come back this year."

The 25th Annual Benefit will be held May 21 and 22, 2015, at the Sechrest 18 of the Mozingo Lake Golf Course, Maryville, MO. Tee times will be Thursday, May 21, at 1:30 p.m. and Friday, May 22, at 8:30 a.m. A special dinner to honor the Tobins and those that have been associated with the tournament over the past 25 years will be held Thursday evening at the Maryville Coun-


try Club. The first tournament, held June 19, 1991, was a three-person scramble at the Maryville Country Club and raised \$11,000 for x-ray equipment. The event held in 2006 raised the most funds at nearly \$58,000. In 2003, the Classic saw its highest number of golf-

ers at 412. This year's tournament will also be momentous for reaching another milestone. As announced at the St. Francis Gala in February, the Foundation fundraisers (both golf and gala) will top the \$1 million mark for proceeds that go directly to St. Francis Hospital for patient needs. Over the years, The Tobin alone has contributed over \$888,000 to St. Francis for medical equipment, renovations, and more.

By coincidence, the Foundation recently funded the purchase of a new fluoroscopy machine for the Imaging Department. "The first three Tobin golf tournaments (1991 through 1993) raised funds for the equipment replaced this past December," explained Rita Miller, Community Relations and Development Manager. "The x-ray equipment purchased in 1993 cost \$370,000 while its replacement, purchased in 2014, although at relatively the same price has advanced digital capabilities."

This year's tournament is raising funds for technology in the Imaging Department once again. Only this time, it's for an ultrasound machine to replace an older second unit.

The Foundation's Board of Directors has also indicated that a portion of this year's proceeds will go toward supporting the Watson 9 youth course development at Mozingo. The Tobin has been held at Mozingo for at least the last 16 years and recognition of the park's



Ethan Karsten, a junior at Platte 3 District 4 Tournament at Oak City, MO, is the 2015 Class 3 Missouri State 145 Pound Wrestling Champion. This is Ethan's second state championship. 


