Terry Petersen takes job at Nodaway-Holt

Craig, MO, High School Principal Terry Petersen has accepted the position as grades 7-12 high school principal in the Nodaway-Holt School District at Graham, MO. The decision to hire Petersen was made at the regular board meeting of Nodaway-Holt R-VII on Tuesday evening, May 17.

Petersen will be replacing Ethan Sickels. Sickels served two years as elementary principal in the Nodaway-Holt School District and, this past year, as high school principal there. He also did some coaching while at Nodaway-Holt. Sickels is leaving the field of education to take a job in Texas.

Petersen, who resides just outside Mound City, has been at Craig for the past seven years, serving as kindergarten

through 12th grade principal, athletic director and coach. Prior to that, he spent 16 years at Mound City R-2 teaching social studies, coaching and serving as athletic director.

Petersen will assume his new duties on August 1. Craig R-3 will be advertising for Petersen's replacement. Petersen commented on his decision, "I have been fortunate to work with a lot of outstanding people during my tenure at Craig and I really appreciate the opportunity that I was given there. I'll miss the people I've worked with over the last seven years. The Nodaway-Holt position is something I'm really excited about and I certainly look forward to working with the staff and students this fall."

Mound City Museum/Holt County Historical Society to honor L Company

The Mound City Museum and the Holt County Historical Society will join together to honor the veterans of Holt County on Sunday afternoon, May 29, at 2 p.m. at the Depot Museum on south State Street in Mound City, MO. Special recognition will be given to L Company, the WWI unit that was formed in Mound City in 1917.

Richard Barrett, Mound City, will share the history of Paul Pierce Shutts, a member of L Company, who lost his life, September 27, 1918, in France at the battle of Argonne during WWI. Shutts is buried in Mound City's Mount Hope Cemetery. The local legion is named for him.

A *Mound City News* headline, dated November 8, 1918, states, "They Gave Their All For The Flag". The deaths of four Holt County boys listed in that pub-

lication are Sergeant Paul P. Shutts, Claude Fleming, Tassel Dovel and Frank Chuning.

Several soldiers had written letters home sharing where they were and these were published in that paper. Charles S. Stuart, Fortescue, MO, and Frost Browning, Mound City, were in France. John Cardinell and Roy Tibbitts, both from Mound City, stated they were in a hospital "somewhere in France". Miss Minnie Strobel, Mound City, a Red Cross nurse in France, wrote her parents, Mr. and Mrs. J.C. Strobel, sharing her duties and experiences.

Anyone with WWI memorabilia, photos and clippings is encouraged to bring these to display. The Mound City Museum will be open all afternoon for visitors. Refreshments will be served.

Lifeguard training and CPR/First Aid courses offered

The American Red Cross lifeguard training course will be offered in the Mound City area beginning on Thursday, May 26, 2011. This course is open to all experienced swimmers who are at least 15 years old and who would like to lifeguard in a pool environment.

New lifeguards will need to take the complete lifeguarding course that will be held in the basement of the Christian Fellowship Church, North Hwy. 59, Mound City, MO, and at Northwest Missouri State University (NWMSU) in Maryville, MO. The course will meet at the church on Thursday, May 26, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Friday, May 27, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday, May 28, will be the required pool session at NWMSU from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Those attending should meet at the church at 8 a.m., bring their swimsuit, sack lunch, goggles and plenty of

towels. Transportation will be provided. The cost of the course for new lifeguards is \$150.

The CPR challenge renewal will be on Friday, May 27, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Christian Fellowship Church in Mound City. The cost for renewing CPR is \$30. The material should be reviewed ahead of time and masks brought to the session.

Lifeguards that were certified in 2008 must renew both CPR/First Aid and the water skills to keep their certification. Attendance is required on Friday, May 27, for CPR/First Aid renewal and attendance is required on Saturday, May 28, for water skills renewal. Cost for renewing is \$75.

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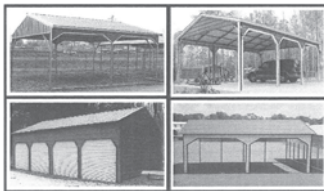

The next generation of audio books has made it to the Mound City Public Library. The Playaway is the simplest way to listen to audio on the go. Each Playaway comes with the digital content already pre-loaded and a battery to make it play. Simply plug in ear buds and enjoy. (Ear buds are available for \$1 at the library.) The new device is smaller than a deck of cards and hangs from a lanyard. The small device operates easily and is very functional, just plug in ear buds and go. It is great for listening to a book on the go, during exercise, house or yard work, or simply laying around. The Mound City Library obtained 17 different Play-

away titles as part of a temporary trial from the Grand River Library Conference to determine the need for such a service to be offered here. A subscription for the set of 17 different titles would rotate every quarter if the library decides to get the membership. A variety of titles are available on the Playaway, including contemporary, modern fiction, Christian fiction and others. Two squads of five members participated in the FFA Division. The Nodaway-Holt Alpha Squad was composed of members Luke Coffelt, Dale Swartz, Josh Schafer, Andrew Strauch and Stephen Schniedermeyer. Chapter members Zach Lemar, Darcy Brown, Amanda O'Riley, Trent Lett and Ryan Ginther were on the Nodaway-Holt Bravo Squad. The Alpha Squad

placed second in the FFA Division with the squad receiving a plaque and each of the five individuals receiving a Runner-Up Championship Belt Buckle. In addition, Stephen Schniedermeyer received an additional Belt Buckle for Runner-Up sophomore in the overall competition for posting the score of 98 out of 100 targets.

This competition was hosted by the Missouri Trapshooters' Association and the Missouri Department of Conservation. There were 932 Missouri Junior High and High School students that participated in the event. The Nodaway-Holt chapter has 25 members and the FFA advisor is Steve Schniedermeyer.

Spring turkey harvest down 9.3 percent Mound City golfers compete at state

Wet, windy weather plagued hunters throughout much of the season

A 9.3-percent dip in the 2011 spring turkey harvest confirms what Missourians already knew – it was a stormy three weeks in the Show-Me State.

Resource Scientist Jason Isabelle, the Conservation Department's turkey specialist, announced that hunters checked 38,328 turkeys during the regular spring turkey season, which was held April 18 through May 8. That is down 9.3 percent from last year.

Adding the harvest from the youth turkey season, which was held April 9 and 10, brings Missouri's 2011 spring turkey harvest to 42,226. That is down 8.6 percent from last year. Spring turkey permit sales were down 4,885, or 3.3 percent, from last year.

Top harvest counties were Franklin, with 840 turkeys checked, Texas with 699 and Bollinger with 675. Juvenile gobblers, known as "jakes", made up 19.6 percent of the harvest. That is virtually identical to last year, when jakes comprised 20 percent of the harvest.

Isabelle predicted a smaller harvest this year because of a decline in turkey numbers

statewide.

"We still have very strong wild turkey numbers in most areas compared to other states," said Isabelle, "but there is no question that the population is down, and more in some areas than others. That was bound to affect our harvest this year. Cool, rainy and often windy conditions during much of turkey season magnified the effect."

Isabelle said the season got off to a good start. The youth harvest was virtually identical to last year's, and the opening-day harvest was slightly higher than in 2010. Then it turned cool and turned stormy.

Isabelle said rain, cool temperatures and wind have a double negative effect on hunting success. Stormy weather causes male turkeys to gobble less, making them harder to hunt. Nasty weather also discourages hunters from going afield.

"The turkeys are out there every day," said Isabelle. "You can hunt them effectively, even on rainy days, but it's harder, and it can be uncomfortable. Quite a few hunters choose not to hunt at all on rainy days. I suspect that when we look at our hunter survey data, we'll see a reduction in the number of days that hunters took to the field this spring."

Isabelle said he doesn't expect this spring's relatively light harvest to have a significant effect on the state's turkey population. This is partly because 99 percent of the harvested turkeys are males, and turkey reproduction is determined by the number of hens. Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) sets the hunting season late enough in the spring to allow ample opportunity for gobblers and hens to breed prior to the start of the season.

"Harvesting 4,000 fewer gobblers in the spring is a mi-

nor factor compared to annual reproduction," said Isabelle. "In a good year, our hens can produce more than 300,000 poults (young turkeys). That dwarfs the total number of gobblers we harvest, even when hunting conditions are good."

Isabelle said Missouri has enough wild-turkey hens to stage a population recovery. To do that, however, the birds need favorable weather. Wet conditions take a toll on nesting success of ground-nesting birds like turkeys. It also reduces survival of poults, which are susceptible to hypothermia when cool, wet weather prevails.

Isabelle said wet conditions so far this spring have not helped turkey nesting, but most areas haven't been as hard-hit as southeastern Missouri.

"Even in areas where flooding has occurred, hens still have time to re-nest and bring off a good crop of poults," Isabelle said. "We have had several years of bad nesting conditions, but I'm hoping this will be the year when we get warmer, drier weather, and turkey numbers bounce back a bit. May and June are critical months for wild turkey production, and it's still not too late for conditions to improve."

The MDC recorded three firearms-related hunting incidents during the regular turkey season. None were fatal. Two incidents, including a fatal self-inflicted gunshot, occurred during the youth season. Last year, the agency recorded four incidents during the regular season and two during the youth season. None of last year's incidents were fatal.

County-by-county spring turkey harvest totals are available at the MDC website, www.missouriconservation.org. Search for "2011 turkey harvest".

Mound City junior, Jeff Atkins, in his first appearance at state, shot a 93 and a 91, respectively, in the two-day event. His combined score of 184 placed him tied for 65th overall.

For the past five years, Missouri's state highway construction program has averaged \$1.2 billion a year. The Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) has presented a new, five-year construction program to the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission that's only half that amount -- about \$600 million a year.

What does such a sharp decline in funding mean to Missourians?

"It means the investment that has supported Missouri jobs is in jeopardy," said MoDOT Director Kevin Keith. "It means the investment that has helped save lives is in jeopardy, and it means the investment that supports Missouri's economy and touches every industry in the state from agriculture to healthcare is in jeopardy."

Moving forward, the transportation department will reach the point where it will not have enough state revenue to match federal funding, and that will mean the state will lose millions of dollars for transportation projects. The federal government allocates funding to the states using a formula that requires the states to match a percentage of the money.

"This is not a surprise," Keith said. "We knew this day was coming. We've fallen off of the cliff. We're at the bottom, and now we have to pull ourselves up, scrape the dust off and figure out what we can do to increase funding for transportation."

To cope with this funding challenge, MoDOT is focusing on delivering commitments promised Missouri citizens -- keeping major highways in good condition, improving smaller state roads and keeping pace with needed bridge repairs and maintenance. The department is cutting internal costs and directing all available resources to taking care of existing roads and bridges.

"While these cost savings provide a temporary fix, they do not solve our funding situation in the long term," said Keith.

The draft 2012-2016 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program lists transportation projects planned by state and regional planning agencies for fiscal years 2012 through 2016 (July 1, 2011 -- June 30, 2016). The proposed program is available for public review, which began Thursday, May 5. Citizens interested in seeing the program or offering comments can contact MoDOT's customer service centers at 1-888 ASK MODOT (275-6636). The program is also available on MoDOT's web site -- www.modot.org -- and at MoDOT's district offices around the state. The formal public comment period ends Friday, June 3.

Following the public review, the comments will be presented to the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission. The commission will review the comments and the final transportation program before considering it for approval on Wednesday, July 13.
