## Mustang suspected to have been killed by mountain lion

An adopted 800-900 pound mustang, owned by Justin Rother, was attacked and killed by what he believed to be a mountain lion on his father's farm northeast of Craig, MO, on Wednesday, May 12.

Greg, Justin's father, saw the mustang Wednesday morning around 9:30 a.m. as he was doing chores. Approximately two hours later, he noticed the mustang from a distance having obvious problems. Greg called Justin and told him that he needed to check on the mustang because he appeared to be having some trouble.

According to Justin, who arrived about 30 minutes later, the mustang was in a ravine in a pasture, dead. Noticing two or three mountain lions near the horse as he approached from a distance, however he headed back to the house for a rifle. When he returned, the mountain lions were out of range and the shots missed their mark.

Justin and his dad examined the horse, which lay dead in a muddy area, and found several sets of four deep claw marks along with puncture wounds at the mustang's jugular vein. Claw marks, both on the front neck area and two sets along the hind quarters, ranged from six to 12 inches in length and varied in depth.

This was not the first time that Justin has seen a mountain lion on their farm. He also ran across one approximately three years ago during deer season north of Craig. He and his father made a plaster cast of the track that was left in the snow from the mountain lion. Greg also spotted one this winter near their home.

"It takes awhile to decide what you're seeing, because they shouldn't be here," Greg

stated. "The way they move across the ground and their long tail make it obvious what it is, though."

Mountain lions require a lot of area, their home range is typically 50 to 75 square miles for females and 90 to several hundred square miles for males. A mountain lion's head and body range from three to five feet in length, with their tail measuring 23 to 33 inches. The cats can weigh upwards of 160 pounds.

Interestingly, the Rother's have also had a cow killed this spring with no explanation, as well as a black lab that was ripped from backbone to belly button during the winter snowstorms.

According to Missouri Conservation Department officials, there have been 10 confirmed mountain lions in Missouri since 1994, the latest being pictures from a trail camera near Chillicothe in 2006. Another was hit by a car near downtown Kansas City in 2002 and another in 2003 near Fulton.

Missouri Conservation Agent Russ Shifflett visited the Rother farm and after investigating stated, "This one is unique enough to send pictures to our Mountain Lion Response Team. It's unconfirmed as a mountain lion attack as of now, but it is out of the ordinary for a livestock kill."

Shifflett indicated that there are numerous calls each year in Holt County about mountain lions, but none have yet to be confirmed here. The agency is interested in confirming sightings, but need of pictures, video or tracks are necessary.

An eyewitness account, compounded with the irrefutable marks left behind on the deceased mustang, sure does make it difficult for an amateur to say that there aren't any mountain lions in northwest Missouri. With keen awareness of the dangers that lurk in the area, the Rother's plan to be prepared should another mountain lion show up for another tasty meal.

## New street tax to be on August ballot

The Mound City Board of Aldermen voted unanimously to adopt a bill that seeks to impose a half cent sales tax for city streets. The ordinance, numbered Ordinance #1156, would be placed on the ballot for voter approval in August.

The tax would generate approximately \$62,000-\$68,000 per year, becoming effective January 1, 2011, with distribution to the city beginning in March 2011.

The Board of Aldermen chose to attempt the implementation of the tax for a couple of reasons. Aldermen

feel the tax is warranted because the street department revenue sources, i.e. state motor vehicle tax, state fuel tax and city stickers do not keep up with annual street maintenance and supply costs (the costly snow removal from last winter comes from this same fund). Secondly, they would like to see a permanent source of funding in order to keep city streets repaired.

The half cent tax would assist with basic street repairs and chip and seal projects needed throughout the city.

# Edwin L. "Ted" Tyson

Edwin Louis "Ted" Tyson was born to Edwin and Lettie (Walkup) Tyson on January 18, 1918, in rural Atchison County, MO. He graduated from Daleview High School and Northwest Missouri State University at Maryville, MO. After teaching a few years, Ted was inducted into the Army and served in the Pacific area during World War II.

After completing his Army term, Ted graduated from the University of Washington in Seattle, WA, with a Master's Degree in Library Science. He accepted a position as librarian of San Jose City College. He retired from there in 1972 and moved to his home in Nevada City, CA, where he died at age 92.

Ted is survived by a sister, Marcia Tyson Symanski, Maryville; nephew, Turner W. Tyson, II, Jefferson City, MO; niece, Barbara Tyson Finn, Pensacola, FL; and numerous great-nephews and nieces. A nephew, Edwin Chaves Tyson, is deceased.

# Home Exchange Bank celebrates 85 years

Home Exchange Bank in Oregon, MO, previously known as Zook and Roecker Bank, was acquired in 2000 and taken as a branch of the Home Exchange Bank that established itself in 1925 in Jamesport, MO.

In 1925, Jamesport was a thriving community. World War I had ended and progress was booming. A group of area men saw the need for a bank in Jamesport.

Organized on May 25, 1925, and incorporated on May 29, 1925, the following were shareholders and served on the Board of Directors: T. H. Tye of Cameron, Ott Stein and John M. Grimes of Trenton, Jack Ferguson, W. L. Hill, D. T. Reed, P. S. McCue, Chas I. Jorden and George O. Mills, Jamesport. Other shareholders were J. O. Buren, John Gildow and J. McBrown, Jamesport.

The bank's capital stock was \$20,000, with a \$5,000 surplus. Located in the building formerly known as People's Exchange Bank, this new bank was named Home Exchange Bank. People's Exchange Bank had been organized in the 1800's and after falling on hard times, had gone under.

A.V. Spillman was named to the Board of Directors and took the reins as cashier on June 28, 1927. In January of 1933, he became president and continued in that capacity until 1963. His guidance helped establish a very sound banking institution.

After A.V.'s death, his son, Grimes Spillman, became

president and served in that position until 1982. Under his direction, the banking facility in Gilman City was established on July 30, 1963.

Terry Spillman, grandson of A.V. Spillman, and son of Grimes Spillman, began working in the bank during the summer of 1972. Through the years, this third generation Spillman served as president and CEO, sometimes wearing both hats at the same time.

Ray Dockery became the bank president in 1991, and continues to serve in that capacity to this day. Terry Spillman continues as the CEO. Other Board of Directors for 2010 include Claude Eckert-Trenton, Vistor Liton- Lock Springs, Don Scheib- Oregon and Jim Ranes- Jamesport.

It was under their leadership that the Zook and Roecker Bank was acquired in 2000.

Eighty-five years after that first vision for a bank in Jamesport, the Home Exchange Bank is stronger than ever. With three locations, Home Exchange Bank continues to be the solid hometown back people trust. Though the faces have changed through the years, those who currently represent Home Exchange Bank remain steadfast to continue being the full service bank, the Bank of Personal Service, to which customers have become accustomed.

Home Exchange Bank is planning a celebration in a few weeks. More information will be released later.

## Work on the Burlington Northern Santa Fe

The excavator in the photo above was being used to remove rock and dirt along the right of way at the railroad crossing in Craig, MO, on Thursday, May 13.

The undercutter, at the front left of the photo, once it had scoped up the material alongside the rails and ties, used a bar or chain, which is slid along and underneath the track structure, then loosened and freed the material. This particular cleanup would clean under 30-40 ties, at a depth of up to two feet.

These type of spot cleanings are being done as part of routine work done along the many miles of track in our area. Once the area below the track was cleaned, new rock would be used to fill in between the ties and tracks.

Railroad undercutters have been around in one shape or another since the steam era and today have not really changed much more than becoming larger and more efficient at their primary task.

Today's machines, operated by either railroads or contractors, can scoop up between six inches and two or more feet deep of material at once, typically rolling along at just a few feet per minute.

Two longtime BNSF employees, Kurt Prussman, 40 year BNSF veteran, and Bob Barton, 34 year BNSF veteran, were on hand overseeing the job.

"You'll be seeing trains full of coal coming through here in less than two years," remarked Bob Barton, indicating the tracks running through Craig. "The coal train traffic through Nebraska is too busy. They'll have to start bringing it through here from Powder River Basin in Wyoming."

Lifeguards that were certified in 2007 must renew both CPR/First Aid and the water skills to keep their certification. Attendance is required on Wednesday, May 26, for CPR renewal and attendance is required on Friday, May 28, for water skills renewal. STIMULUS FUNDING TO PROVIDE  
FREE VACCINES FOR CHILDREN  
AND ADOLESCENTS

Special funding has been made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) for Holt County Health Department to provide free vaccine to children and adolescents, regardless of insurance status. The goal of this project is to reduce healthcare costs through prevention.

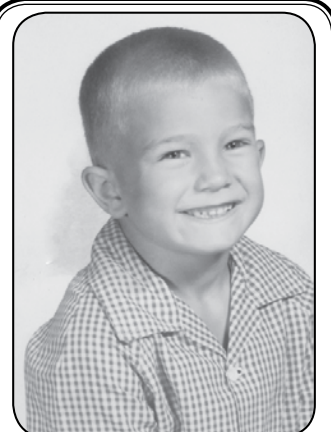
