
What do you remember?

CRAIG SCHOOL 1908

In 1882, at a cost of \$6,000, a new two-story brick building was built in Craig (located where the Craig Supply Service Station is now). An addition to the structure was completed in 1896. In 1936, there were 385 Craig citizens who unanimously voted to construct a new building. The old building would be torn down and what material was suitable would be used in the new structure that would be erected on the Charles Yandall land close by the Standard Service Station (located on the highway in front of where Craig High School is now). The cost would be \$39,000. The work begun as seats and equipment were moved to the town's churches, city hall, and other buildings where classes could begin that fall. The old building was torn down in 1937-38. The first graduating class in the new Craig High School building was in 1938. Anyone recall attending school in the old building? Or moving around to different locations while the new school was being built?







Commissioners then took up the reestablishment of Kayak Road, Holt Road 130 and Holt Road 290 as County Aid Road Trust (CART) roads. Commissioner Carroll made a motion to adopt the roads into the CART program for gravel maintenance. Commissioner Gordon seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.
