

Since there is a lot of misinformation about the baseball fields going around, I thought it was necessary to write this and let everybody know what is going on.

As it was written in this paper last week, one of the light poles at the baseball fields was blown over by the wind last Saturday morning. On Monday, when businesses opened up, I began making calls to try and get a new pole for the field. I was able to make contact with KCP&L and KCP&L officials agreed to sell us a new pole at their cost and install it for free. A new pole is over \$600, not counting the price for new bulbs or new lights. They have also agreed to look at the other poles to try and determine if they are safe. As I understand, this is not an exact science.

We are also looking at putting up newer style lights that should be brighter and should take fewer lights to do the same job. This will depend on whether or not we can do that at the same price as repairing the old lights that were on the pole. Until this is done, the field and the lights that are there can be used safelv.

I would like to thank Glenn Caton for generously donating his time to cover the wires and repair the damaged junction box on the pole that fell over. I would also like to thank Ken Eaton for donating his time to help clean up and haul off the pole and damaged lights.

Any and all donations to this project would be greatly appreciated. Hopefully the other poles are okay and will not need to be replaced at this time. I hope this will clear things



AMC Arthur (Art) Schaeffer, U.S. Navy retiree, passed away peacefully at his home in Bell's Flats, AK, on November 15, 2009. He was 89 years of age.

Art was born August 29, 1920, and was raised in Forest City, MO. Following graduation from high school, he joined the Navy in 1940. He served in World War II aboard the ill-fated USS Yorktown at the Battle of Midway, as well as on several other aircraft carriers; USS Anzio, Korean conflict-USS Tarawa, and during the Vietnam War-USS Kitty Hawk. In between stints at sea, he was stationed at land bases throughout the United States.

In 1944, he met and married his bride of 41 years, LoHama (Red) Mercer. While traveling from base to base, they raised a daughter, Pamela, and a son, Spencer.

Art first came to Kodiak, AK, in 1956 for nine months. Having fallen in love with the island, he volunteered to come back every chance he could. He returned to Kodiak for the 1964 tsunami and was finally stationed there permanently with his family in 1966.

After serving in the Navy for 30 years, he retired in 1970. He went on to work for several local air-taxis. He also managed the on-base civilian club, the VFW and worked as a civil service carpenter.

In the early 1970s, Art and Red moved to Bell's Flats, AK, and began building his salvaged 110 foot long Quonset

He was known for his love of all animals, especially dogs, and his good friends. In his later years, his favorite pastime was taking his dog around the neighborhood while picking up all the other local dogs enroute, feeding them the best sourdough biscuits ever made.

Arthur was preceded in death by his daughter, Pamela; his wife, Red; and his parents, Sam and Lillian. Also preceding him in death were brothers, Floyd, Russell, Orrie and Max; and sisters Pauline, Friday- St. Peter's Lutheran Thelma and Betty.

He is survived by his sisters, Pansy and Margie of Washington; Jacquetta of St. Joseph, MO; and a brother, Sam of Missouri. He is also survived by his son, Spencer, of Kodiak. He will be missed.

Knowing what malware is and how you can keep it off your computer may save you time and money since you won't have to pay to have it professionally removed.

Malware is a general term used to describe any type of damaging software such as Adware, Spyware or Viruses. Adware collects information about your browsing patterns in order to display advertisements in the Web browser. Spyware is software that gathers information from your computer without your knowledge. Instead, go to the task bar at the bottom of your screen and right click on the icon representing the pop-up and left click CLOSE. You may also go to your task manager by pressing "Ctrl, Alt, Delete" and end the program there. If neither option is available, close your other programs and restart your computer.

If you're getting a large screensaver for free, they're probably going to get their money by adding malware along with the download; that's not ok.
