King and Proud Roadhouse closing in on a year of business

The King and Proud Roadhouse in Oregon, MO, was established in August of 2009 by owners David and Enola Kerns, who have a family connection to the community. Enola is the niece of the late Ray and Fern Noland of Oregon, MO. With strong “small town” values and due to the historical nature of the building, the owners capitalized on its history when naming their new restaurant.

Dr. Willard C. Proud was born in Oregon on June 28, 1873. His parents were Clark O. Proud of Ohio and Rebecca (Curtis) Proud of Missouri. Clark left the Buckeye state in the company of his parents and made his way to Oregon, MO, where he and his uncle, Rueben King, established a pharmacy, conducting business under the name of the King & Proud Pharmacy.

Both the east and west sides of the building heralds the names of its predecessors.

King and Proud, 1890, marks the doorway above the east side of the building, which is the entrance and main dining room. The bar is located toward the back and a covered deck at the rear expands the space to the outdoors.

The west side of the building includes the Petree Patio Room, which is available for private parties. The words Petree-Block are etched in the stone on this side of the building. Complete historical information has not yet been obtained, but it is believed that Petree is the name of brothers who were attorneys there and that Harrison Petree, whom the American Legion Post in Oregon is named after, is their descendant.

The Petree Patio Room also includes the “Hole-in-the-Wall” Game Room that has sports theater seating with a giant projection screen TV. A pool table and other video games are also located in this room.

The King and Proud Roadhouse is a moderately-priced grill and bar. Dave and Enoleadsire to offer a comfortable establishment for a variety of persons and support the needs and wants of the community. Pride in service by the owners, who are on the job daily to watch and account for all aspects of the operation, ensures that customers have a pleasant experience with every visit.

The restaurant offers menu options including grilled selections of half pound burgers, chicken tenders, pork tenderloins and pizza, along with several deep fried selections including mushrooms, cheese sticks, onion rings, etc.

Daily specials are offered on menu items, as well as non-menu specials periodically. Dave likes to offer choices and entertains special requests. A variety of adult beverages are also available, including a few wine selections.

Mound City Police Chief injured in accident on Hwy. N

Mound City Police Chief John Panning was injured at 9:45 p.m. Thursday, May 27, while assisting a stranded motorist along the west side of Route N near Mound City, MO.

When Misty Hendrix, 31, Mound City, attempted to pass farm vehicles stopped in the northbound lane, she struck Panning. He came to rest in the southbound lane.

Panning was taken to Heartland Regional Medical Center by ambulance and was released Friday afternoon. He sustained no broken bones, but was reported to have a suffered a severe

concussion, as well as bruising and skin lacerations on his left side.

Panning became nauseous and sick from headaches and dizziness on Saturday and returned to the emergency room at Heartland. After more testing and administering medicine for the nausea, he was again released.

“I’m just glad to be here,” Panning stated.

Police Chief Panning will have his checkup with his family doctor and get a timeline of when he may be able to resume a normal schedule.

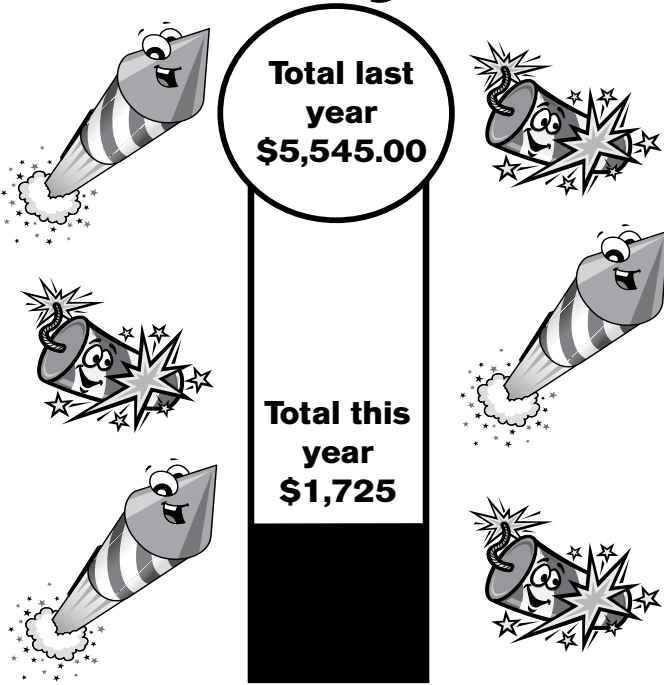

Dear Editor,

Since there is a lot of misinformation about the baseball fields going around, I thought it was necessary to write this and let everybody know what is going on.

As it was written in this paper last week, one of the light poles at the baseball fields was blown over by the wind last Saturday morning. On Monday, when businesses opened up, I began making calls to try and get a new pole for the field. I was able to make contact with KCP&L and KCP&L officials agreed to sell us a new pole at their cost and install it for free. A new pole is over \$600, not counting the price for new bulbs or new lights. They have also agreed to look at the other poles to try and determine if they are safe. As I understand, this is not an exact science.

We are also looking at putting up newer style lights that should be brighter and should take fewer lights to do the same job. This will depend on whether or not we can do that at the same price as repairing the old lights that were on the pole. Until this is done, the field and the lights that are there can be used safely.

I would like to thank Glenn Caton for generously donating his time to cover the wires and repair the damaged junction box on the pole that fell over. I would also like to thank Ken Eaton for donating his time to help clean up and haul off the pole and damaged lights.

Any and all donations to this project would be greatly appreciated. Hopefully the other poles are okay and will not need to be replaced at this time. I hope this will clear things up a little.

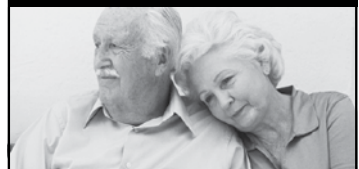

Arthur W. Schaeffer

AMC Arthur (Art) W. Schaeffer, U.S. Navy retiree, passed away peacefully at his home in Bell's Flats, AK, on November 15, 2009. He was 89 years of age.

Art was born August 29, 1920, and was raised in Forest City, MO. Following graduation from high school, he joined the Navy in 1940. He served in World War II aboard the ill-fated USS Yorktown at the Battle of Midway, as well as on several other aircraft carriers; USS Anzio, Korean conflict-USS Tarawa, and during the Vietnam War-USS Kitty Hawk. In between stints at sea, he was stationed at land bases throughout the United States.

In 1944, he met and married his bride of 41 years, LoHama (Red) Mercer. While traveling from base to base, they raised a daughter, Pamela, and a son, Spencer.

Art first came to Kodiak, AK, in 1956 for nine months. Having fallen in love with the island, he volunteered to come back every chance he could. He returned to Kodiak for the 1964 tsunami and was finally stationed there permanently with his family in 1966.

After serving in the Navy for 30 years, he retired in 1970. He went on to work for several local air-taxis. He also managed the on-base civilian club, the VFW and worked as a civil service carpenter.

In the early 1970s, Art and Red moved to Bell's Flats, AK, and began building his salvaged 110 foot long Quonset hut.

He was known for his love of all animals, especially dogs, and his good friends. In his later years, his favorite pastime was taking his dog around the neighborhood while picking up all the other local dogs enroute, feeding them the best sourdough biscuits ever made.

Arthur was preceded in death by his daughter, Pamela; his wife, Red; and his parents, Sam and Lillian. Also preceding him in death were brothers, Floyd, Russell, Orrie and Max; and sisters Pauline, Thelma and Betty.

He is survived by his sisters, Pansy and Margie of Washington; Jacquetta of St. Joseph, MO; and a brother, Sam of Missouri. He is also survived by his son, Spencer, of Kodiak. He will be missed.

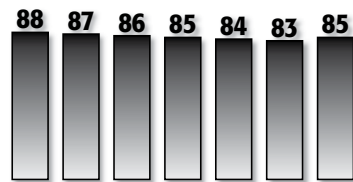

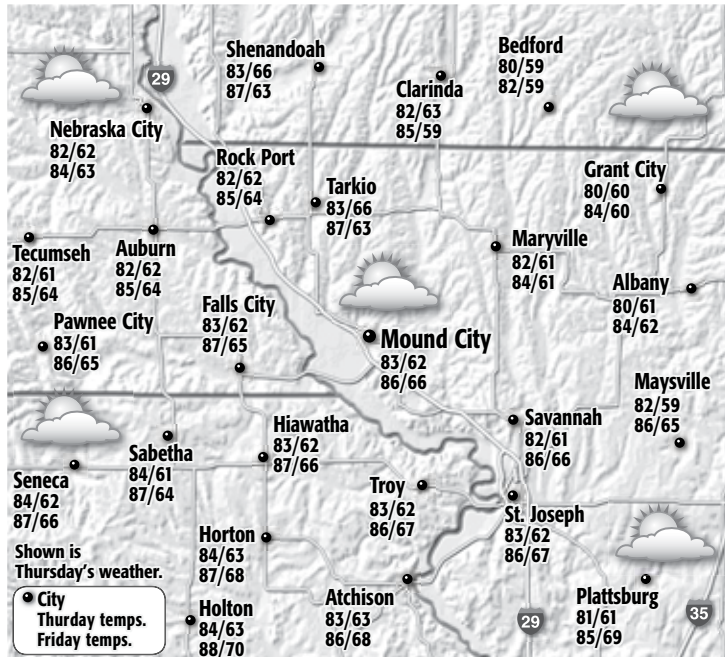

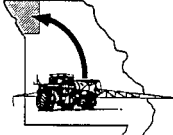

Holt County Commission minutes Revenue fails to meet expenditures

The Holt County Commission met Monday, May 24, 2010, at 9:00 a.m. with Presiding Commissioner Mark Sitherwood, First District Commissioner Bill Gordon and Second District Commissioner Don Holstine present.

After review, Commissioner Gordon made a motion to accept the minutes as written by County Clerk Kathy J. Kunkel. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Holstine.

Dennis Saunders, Bigelow Independent Road District, joined the commission to request that the allotment of the 2010 County Aid Road Trust (CART) be applied at the onset of the summer season at Big Lake. Following discussion, Commissioner Gordon made a motion to allow Bigelow Independent Road District to hire, by bid process, persons to haul the 2010 allocation of CART road rock in the sum of 2,157 tons to the district roads. The County Road and Bridge Department will not haul those tons per previous agreements. Commissioner Holstine seconded the motion. Commissioner Sitherwood, who resides in the special district, abstained.

Further discussion was undertaken related to future allocations of the one-half cent local CART sales tax and expenditures of the district's property tax levy.

Road and Bridge Supervisor Daryl Biermann joined the commission to discuss work in progress and to review the 2010 Budget projections with County Clerk Kathy J. Kunkel. The budget is very tight, with heavy expenditures made during the winter blizzards, summer projects will be delayed. The general operating budget has \$180,000 cash balance compared to \$398,000 in the same period last year. Year to date revenues are \$418,000 with expenditures at \$388,000. Commissioners reviewed budgetary line items for expenditures.

Brenda Nelson, R.N., Health Department Administrator, met with the commissioners to renew a state contract for on-site sewage inspection. Any persons planning to replace or install a septic sewage system should contact the Holt County Health Department for current regulations required for sewage capacity and soil type.

Commissioners reviewed roadway cuts on Maywood and Holt 250. Commissioner Gordon determined the road must be fixed, it continues to deteriorate. County forces will repair the cuts made by buried cable for Oregon Farmer's Mutual Telephone in Oregon. Commissioners decided to document the cuts with photographs and to detail the cost involved to make repairs with a charge to OFM.

County Clerk Kathy J. Kunkel reviewed the 2010 General Revenue Budget with the commissioners. General Revenue has \$266,000 cash on hand, down from \$322,000 on January 1, 2010, and down \$138,000 from \$404,000 in the same period in 2009. Departmental budgets are running on par and revenues are failing to keep pace with budget expenditures. For 2010, total revenues are \$680,000 with expenditures at \$736,000. At this pace, General Revenue will be at \$0.00 by year end.

Being no further business, Commissioner Sitherwood adjourned the meeting until Tuesday, June 1, 2010, at 9:00 a.m.

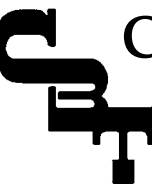

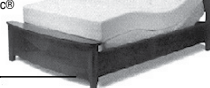

Tech Talk

Knowing what malware is and how you can keep it off your computer may save you time and money since you won't have to pay to have it professionally removed.

Malware is a general term used to describe any type of damaging software such as Adware, Spyware or Viruses. Adware collects information about your browsing patterns in order to display advertisements in the Web browser. Spyware is software that gathers information from your computer without your knowledge. It can be fairly innocent such as for advertising purposes or it can be malicious such as collecting passwords or credit card information. A Virus is a software program designed to destroy or in-

terfere with a computer or software program. There are many different types of viruses, the most common being Trojans and Worms. Trojans are common in the form of pop-ups; users click to get rid of the pop-up and unintentionally launch the virus. Worms are viruses that spread across a network of computers.

If a pop-up appears, do not X out of it or click CANCEL, as this may actually download the malware. Instead, go to the task bar at the bottom of your screen and right click on the icon representing the pop-up and left click CLOSE. You may also go to your task manager by pressing “Ctrl, Alt, Delete” and end the program there. If neither option is available, close your other programs and restart your computer.

While browsing the in-

ternet, it is important to remember that no one is going to give you something for nothing. If you are considering downloading something advertised as free, first try to figure out how they are going to make money by giving you the download. For instance, if someone is offering a free trial of antivirus, they hope to make money by selling you the full version; it's probably OK to go ahead. If you're getting a large screensaver for free, they're probably going to get their money by adding malware along with the download; that's not ok.
