A small contingency of interested citizens- Attended the Midwest Transmission Project public meeting hosted by KCP&L and Omaha Public Power District (OPPD) at the Mound City School on Tuesday, August 21. The open forum meeting allowed citizens to be taken through a series of explanation boards by various members of the two companies explaining plans to construct a possible transmission line through Holt County.

Meetings explain transmission line requirements to landowners

Approximately 20 representatives from KCP&L and the Omaha Public Power District (OPPD) were on hand at a public meeting at the Mound City School on Tuesday, August 21, allowing local citizens the opportunity to learn and ask questions about the Midwest Transmission Project (MTP). The two companies are working in partnership to ultimately construct a new 345 kV transmission line from Sibley, MO, to Nebraska City, NE. These lines could ultimately be built through Holt County.

The Southwest Power Pool (SPP), a regional transmission organization, oversees compliance enforcement and reliability standards development. The SPP is mandated to ensure reliable supplies of power, adequate transmission infrastructure, and competitive wholesale prices for electricity. This project is determined to be a

'priority', and KCP&L and OPPD are responsible for making it happen. The project will provide an alternative route for electricity during emergencies and greater service reliability across northwest Missouri, eastern Nebraska and the surrounding region. It will also reduce congestion on the current system.

The open forum style meeting allowed for personal explanation of the process behind the need and the placement of the new lines. The purpose of the initial meetings is to gather information from the public, residents, landowners and stakeholders in preparation for the routing process for the new lines. Following the various meetings, this fall, the companies will begin developing the potential routes, which may be as many as 3,000 initially. At the vari-

Landowners vote to complete work on Holt County Levee District #15

A meeting of landowners of Holt County Levee District #15 was held on Thursday, August 23, 2012, at the Legion Building in Craig, MO. At said meeting, the Board of Levee District 15, Steve Cunningham, Vice-President, acting President in the absence of President Johnny Haer, and Secretary Eddie Drewes opened the meeting. They explained the purpose of the meeting was for the presentation of the proposed work to be completed by the district and for return of assessment; and for the landowners to then vote on whether or not to complete the work. Randy Mendenhal of Snyder Engineering presented plans and specifications for the work to be completed by the district.

The district will be rebuilding

the high bank levee constructed prior to the flooding by local farmers. The levee will tie in on the south end with Union Levee District's levee southwest of Gail Heitman's residence. The levee will run along the high bank and tie into the Big Tarkio River levee behind the chicken barns west of the Haer property. The district will also assume responsibility of a portion of the Big Tarkio River levee on the east side that has historically been maintained by the Big Tarkio Drainage District. This section is where the breach occurred the previous year and approximately a quarter mile north thereof to the southern line of responsibility of the Big Tarkio Drainage District.

After presentation of the pro-

posed work and assessment, landowners were told the expected cost of the levee. Landowners were informed that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has committed \$1,043,966 for levee repair within the district, and the 25% required local contributions to the FEMA levee repair projects will be funded through Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds totaling \$302,074. Total additional funds required for the proposed levee work were explained to be approximately \$265,000, resulting in a one-time construction tax of 18% or .18/ assessed dollar value. Landowners will be given the option of paying the tax over a 3-year period with the statutorily required interest of 8% charged on

outstanding installments. Landowners were also informed that a maintenance tax of approximately 2% would be assessed.

After presentation of the information and answering of landowner questions, the vote was held. A simple majority of landowners voting in person, power of attorney, attorney or proxy was required to pass the tax for the proposed work. The vote was counted by Holt County Clerk Kathy Kunkel, and passed by a vote of 80 in favor to 21 against. Work is expected to begin this fall after harvest. The Northwest Missouri Regional Council of Governments will be administering the solicitation of bids and grant administration and oversee the construction process.

ous meetings, representatives garnered information and plotted areas like cemeteries and flyways that will be excluded from the routing area. The final routing plan should be completed by the summer of 2013.

The project will span 150-190 miles, with the units typically taking 125-150 foot areas along the route. The project will acquire a one time easement for construction, with the land still owned and operated by the original landowner. The area will have to be maintained under certain specifications pertaining

to buildings, vegetation and grade.

The project will work through the winter of 2014 to acquire environmental permits, with construction to begin the summer of 2015. The project estimates that the in-service of the new lines will be in the summer of 2017.

Atchison-Holt Ambulance District uses funds to purchase pediatric traction splints

The Missouri Bureau of Emergency Medical Services would like to recognize the Atchison-Holt Ambulance District for supporting the Missouri Emergency Medical Services for Children State Partnership Grant in its endeavor to provide the best possible emergency medical care to the pediatric population.

Without the necessary pediatric medical equipment and supplies, healthcare professionals are limited in the quality of care they can provide to the nation's children. It is thus imperative that pre-hospital emergency care providers, emergency department (ED) personnel, and office-based pediatricians/physicians have the appropriate equipment and supplies to provide care for the critically ill and injured children they may encounter in their practice.

A number of professional organizations and government agencies have addressed this issue through the development of essential and/or recommended equipment and supply lists for inclusion in basic life support (BLS) and advanced life support (ALS) ambulances, EDs, and physicians' offices.

With the Atchison-Holt Ambulance District's participation on the latest Pediatric Readiness Survey, the Missouri Emergency Medical Services for Children State Partnership Grant was able to identify that only 73% of Missouri's ground ambulance services had pediatric sized traction splints. Pediatric sized traction splints realign a fractured femur to its proper position, reducing pain and restoring perfusion to an injured leg. It also inhibits further hemorrhage and additional nerve, vascular, bone and muscle damage.

The majority of the pediatric sized traction splints were distributed during the latter half of May, 2012, corresponding with National Emergency Medical Services Week, May 20-26, 2012.

Forklift accident leaves Holt County resident with serious injuries

Melissa A. Last, age 26, of Craig, MO, sustained serious injuries in a forklift accident at 2:15 p.m. on Route W, three miles north of Corning, MO, on Wednesday, August 22, 2012. The accident occurred as the forklift Last was driving lurched as it came out of gear, and went airborne, traveling south down a hill toward a pond. Last jumped from the forklift while it was still in motion. The forklift ran over Last before landing in the pond. Last's sister, Amanda Geib, heard her sister scream and ran to investigate. Geib was able to pull Last from the water before calling emergency personnel.

Last was transported by LifeNet helicopter to a Lincoln, NE, hospital. The Al-lis Chalmers forklift, driven by Last, received moderate

damage and was pulled out of the pond by Last's father a couple of days following the accident.

Last underwent surgery Wednesday evening for three fractures in her femur. A rod was placed through the bone. Last also received several staples from a head laceration caused by the forklift. She returned home on Saturday, August 25, and is expecting a 6-8 month full recovery.

Trp. A. S. Rice of the Missouri State Highway Patrol investigated the accident. Trp. Rice was assisted by the Atchison County Sheriff's Department and the Atchison-Holt Ambulance.

Where is Lyke (Lick) Skillet??

A Brown family lived in Dallas Township in the 1870 census and in Bigelow Township in the 1880 census. A daughter, Perlina Ann Brown, was born in 1873, in Holt County, in Lyke Skillet.

Where is this burial?

Members of the Greater Washington Area Historical Society in Washington, Macomb County, Michigan, are researching Civil War veterans from that area and have found that a government issued Military headstone for William Wilkinson (Lt. Colonel, 9 Michigan Infantry) is listed as delivered to a Mound City cemetery. Wilkinson died July 21, 1895, and it is noted in Gone Home I that he is buried in the Old Mound City Cemetery. Need to locate the burial site and tombstone.

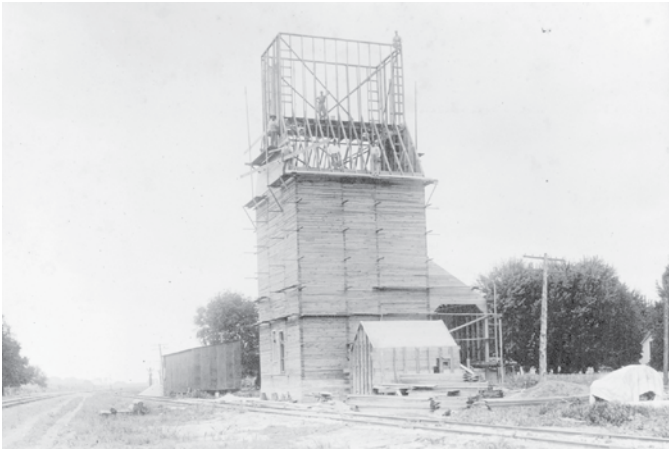

Jeremiah Bragg had 12 receptions for 190 yards and two touchdowns. James Fuller had one reception for 21 yards.

Leading the Knight defense were Colby Markt and Mac Kelly with 11 tackles each. Billy Brock tallied 9 tackles. Jeremiah Bragg and Wyatt Jackson each had a fumble recovery.

The Knights play in Mound City on Friday, August 31, against the Panthers.

Trojans defeat Knights in season opener

The Nodaway-Holt Trojans of Graham, MO, travelled to Oregon, MO, on Friday, August 24, to take on the South Holt Knights in 8-man football competition. The Trojans earned a win, the first win since their 2010 season. The final score was a defined 48-20 win.

Nodaway-Holt tacked up two touchdowns in the first quarter of play, the first of which came on a 6 yard pass to Wade Saxton from Nick Patterson. The extra point kick failed. The Trojans crossed into the end zone on a 3-yard run from Jackson Beattie. Nick Patterson

Justin Dearmont added conversion points to the second touchdown, allowing the Trojans to leave the quarter with a 48-14 lead, with South Holt scoring once during the period.

South Holt added a fourth quarter touchdown, but the Trojans finished with a 48-

20 victory.

"I was happy with the way we started the game," commented Coach Josh Petersen after the game. "We executed really well in the first half and came out with some intensity. Our offensive line provided some nice holes for our backs, and Nick Patterson threw the ball well. We need to continue to improve with our line play for four full quarters. Defensively, we did a good job against the run. We still have a lot of work to do against the pass, however. Overall it was a great way to get the season started."

Wade Saxton led the Trojan rushing with 13 carries for 168 yards. Jackson Beattie had 11 carries for 51 yards, Nick Patterson had 8 carries for 12 yards, and Brice Shamberger had a carry for 3 yards.

Nick Patterson completed 6 of 8 passes for 108 yards. Derek Lemon had two receptions for 41 yards, Brice Shamberger had one for 34 yards, Jackson Beattie had two for 12 yards, and Wade Saxton had one for 6 yards.

John Poppa led the Trojan defense with 13 combined tackles. Nick Patterson and Justin Dearmont had 11 tackles each. Stephen Schniedermeyer had 10, and Cody Schniedermeyer had 9. Derek Lemon and Jackson Beattie had 8 each, and Brice Shamberger and Brian Lance had 7 each.

The Trojans host Stanberry on Friday. They are a team that Coach Petersen remarked would be 'one of the strongest teams in 8-man, and will show what areas Nodaway-Holt needs to improve'.

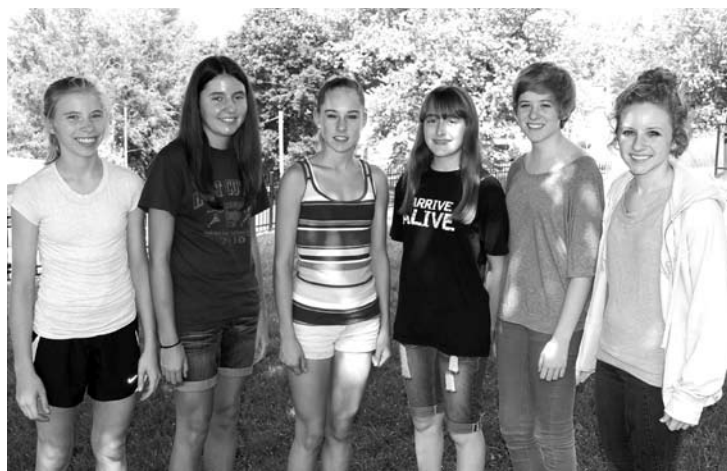

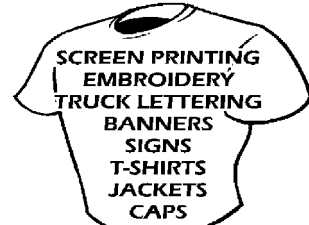
